HOW TO WIN SPONSORS AND FINANCE RALLIES.

Rallying like crops, cars, wine and women's fashion, has it's good years and it's bad years. These seasonal changes vary from State to State. For instance, N.S.W. is just in the process of overcoming a particularly bad plague of CAMS - councils against motor sport, whilst Qld. has enjoyed a couple of excellent seasons, climaxed by the Southern Cross and Warana Rallies last year.

1970 though, promises to be the best rally year yet. The Australian Championship, the relaxing of the ban in N.S.W, the State Championships, the Ampol, and the special events in New Guinea, New Caledonia, New Zealand and our own Southern Cross here in Australia must make this a truly vintage year. It's enough to make even the most timid rally driver eat up his Weeties, practice his karate, read Dale Carnegie, and then go and front up to his wife, his bank manager and his boss, all major obstacles to a rally man's career.

Of course, the best way of overcoming these difficulties is to find a sponsor, but a keen rally enthusiast who happens to own a fur shop, wants to invest half a million dollars in your bank and wants to sign up a fifty thousand dollar a year contract with your company, is a fairly rare person.

However there are other sponsors around who can be persuaded to part with their hard earned cash. If they do, what do they get in return. Their name on the car. Great Fantastic, Good Advertising -- until you go through the first watersplash, followed by a dusty road. Poor eyesight is not a common complaint in Australia but I have yet to see the citizen who can decipher a sponsors name, covered in mud. & dust, at twenty feet and forty miles an hour. OR spectators who want to wipe off an inch of clay so that they can discover whether the two "g"s they can see refer to Cloggs Used Cars or Bloggs Rent a Bird.

Friends, clubmembers, rally enthusiasts, I come before you, not to criticise but to plead our sponsors' cause. Clean cars, pictures in the paper, press releases, this sort of thing will ensure that your sponsor's money will not assume the proportions of your annual tax rebate. Rally organisers too, should ensure that the rally sponsor gets

value for his money. Most of our State Championships are run by excellent club organisations and are sponsored by leading companies. Yet I cannot recall when a sponsor's P.R. officer followed a State Trial. Perhaps on some occasions a fellow has been sent out, but more than likely he has not been able to find the start. For some reason a lot of rally directors seem to feel that the start and finish of a trial should be just as hard to find as the rest of the route. A little more, or perhaps less, imagination on the choice of these important places could result in a lot more publicity. Starting times too, often make it very difficult for the public to see the finish of a trial.

Most clubs, especially those running trials have their own P.R. officer and if he, the rally director and the sponsor's P.R. got together, the 1970 Rally season could be even more lucrative.

Next month look for another uplifting article, not on bras, but on the various types of rallies. And if any of you readers have any comments on the above article, I don't want to hear them unless they are complimentary, but I'm sure your editor would. That's why he asked me to write in the first place: - To fill the blank pages.
