It will be noticed from the above, that the novice and championship events are run together for 2 events, the dates being May 8/9 and December 4/5.

The Brisbane Sporting Car Club again will organise the Warana Rally (Ampol) September 18/19 but the 1971 event will count only towards the point score for the Australian Championship.

The Inter-club Trial (I.W.M.A.C.) will be run on November 13/14, and for the first time since the Qld. Rally Championship inception, will not count towards any championship or series but will be organised as a true club teams event.

The Queensland Novice Rally Series, in which classified competitors are ineligible to compete, will have, apart from the individual sponsors for each rally, a trophy for the winning driver and navigator for each rally of the series.

The winners (driver and navigator) of the series, on a points score system, will also receive a larger trophy (replica of the perpetual one) each, and their names will be engraved on a large perpetual trophy.

Mayfairs have kindly supplied all the trophies, the value of which is in excess of \$ 200.00.

It is hoped that the trophies will all be available soon, and on display, so that you can all see what you will be competing for.
