GRIFFIN UNCHALLENGED AT TOOWOOMBA MOTORKHANA

Surfers Paradise driver Phil Griffin easily won the second round of the Queensland Motorkhana Championship at Toowoomba in his highly modified Cooper "S". Greg Wolshi from Toowoomba was second also driving a Mini, while BSCC members filled the next three placings.

Phil Griffin showed his form right from the start with a 25.0 in the Trefoil 1.3 seconds faster than Wolski and myself. Up and coming BSCC competitor Keith McConnell was fourth fastest in his Cooper "S" on 26.8.

In the Eccentric, Griffin was almost two seconds ahead of second place getter Paul Jones driving a Renault special fitted with tractor tyres all round. This is the first year Jones has competed in motorkhanas and Iam sure he'll be a big threat in the future to the top motorkhana drivers in Queensland.

Wolski broke Griffin's dominance with 37.0 for the Waltz Slalom to Griffin 37.5. Jones was not far behind on 38.3. I did my W.D. for the year (famous last words) in this event and so ruining my chances for the day.

Griffin was back on tops with a 31.6 in the Reverse Garage. Wolski was again second fastest on 32.8 and I was a further .8 sec away in third spot.

A fierce battle was raging in Class B between Dave Ambrose (Mazda 808), Simon Kabel (RX3) and Lindsay Sutherland (Corola). Simon was fastest in the first event with 29.7 but only .2 sec ahead of Dave Ambrose. However, Sutherland netted the next three fastest times in Class B to ship away to a clear lead.

Glen Carpenter was running away in class C driving his potent M.G. 1100: However, Lee Drum and's Mazda was keeping Carpenter honest and Ecc closhed fastest time with Aurthor Freriecks (Citroen) on 41.8 in the Waltz Slalom.

In the Double Garage, Griffin was a second faster than my time of 43.0, then came Snell, really getting stuck into it now, on 44.4 and Wolski on 44.7.

Griffin bolted away in the Long Crossover with 52.7 from myself 55.C, Wolski 57.4 and Snell 57.6. Paul Jones spoiled his good run with a W.D. in this event putting him well back down the field.

The final results saw no change in the first three placings with Griffin winning on 288.5, Wolski 303.3, and Snell not far behind on 305.4. Glen Carpenter brought his Class C M.G. into fourth outright as well as the class win with 314.6. Sutherland won Class B with 324.7 well ahead of Kabel and Ambrose who had a good dice between themselves and ending on 348.1 and 354.3 respectively. Second in Class C was Allan Wheeley on 334.4 from Aurther Freriecks on 336.2. Class D was won by D. Gibson on 355.3 in a Renault 16 TS.

Anyone of at least ten competitors could win this years championship and so there will be great interest focused on the 3rd Round of the Championships conducted by BSCC on the 20th June.

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
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
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"THE GREAT AUSTRALIAN ADVENTURE"

Part 5

Saturday 14th June dawned bright and clear. This was the day that all the crew of the Great Australian Adventure had been waiting for, the day when all those hours of work were to be tested. Would this now resplendant vintage Citroen make it to TOOWOOMBA? Would this beautiful but delicate French Lady behave herself? Would she show the team leader Jim Reddiex, who was really going to call the tune around Australia?

This was to be a full dress rehearsal of the big trip, average speeds, fuel consumptions and driver stress were all to be accurately measured. Ahead was a very big endurance test for men and machines.

It was Saturday and therefore some members were unable to leave at the time when the vintage Citroen pulled out of Maxim Motors in Abbortsford Road. That was no problem as the planned time lag for the back up vehicles had to be tested.

A very proud Jim Reddiex drove the car out of Brisbane alongside him was Boyd Ovens, close behind was Ian Ryan and Trevor Ruddick in a D.S. 23. The day developed into quite a hot winter's day, everything was going well. The crew were to meet on the road several times. Proceedings wound up back at Toombul on the Sunday morning while Adrian Taylor won a "drive on" spot on Channel Seven's Sportscene later in the day.

THE 4TH BIGGENDEN BUSH RALLY

May 1st and 2nd 1976

Queensland Rally
Championship Round 1

The first major rally of the year was run under ideal conditions during the first weekend in May and resulted in a narrow win for Peter Wickham and Alan Rolandsen in their recently re-painted Torana XUI.

Last years winners, Fred Thompson and Jeff Tremain started from the No. I position for the third year in a row and were considered to be odds-on favorites for the event. Their clean sheeted run ended however in Section 9 of Div 1 when they had the misfortune to run full tilt into a large gum tree which had been felled across the road on a blind curve. Fred managed to slow the car on the slippery surface sufficiently to prevent injuries to the crew but not so the car. The full set of Marchal lights caught the tree and are now of little use. The car sustained and estimated \$1,000 worth of damage and after some makeshift repairs was able to be driven under its own power.

No. 2 starters, Ian Riedel and Peter Hines were unable to make it to the start because of business commitments. As Queensland Champions last year they could have put a lot of pressure on Fred and Jeff. Their non-arrival left a small dust free gap for Rad Guerin and Scotty Weir in the Armstrong Motors Datsun 1600. With an eventual loss of 12 points overall they were placed 8th outright and 2nd amongst the Recognised crews.

Starting at No. 5 car Henry Ryman and Bob Lean in the Honda Civic nominated two minutes early in section 4 and due to a misunderstanding about the time allowed for a transport and service, booked in 15 minutes early in Section 11 to be 17 down for Div 1. Problems later in the night cost a further 12 points to leave them on 29 down total and 20th place.

Car 8, Allan Lawson and Greg Weale in the Mazda RX3 were continually plaqued all night with electrical problems but managed to loose only 1 point to give them 7th place outright, and 1st of the Recognised crews.

Trevor Ruddick and Maurice Kelly in the Citroen GS 1200 had tyre problems in the first division to drop 8 points and lost only 5 in the second division for an equal 9th outright and 3rd recongnised crew.

Neil Swaysland and John Hall started at No. 10 in the Datsun 1600 and were running extremely well until they tripped and fell on an uphill, hard left in section 7 of Div 1.

Car II, Wickham and Rolandsen had a reasonably trouble-free run, clean sheeting Div 1, nominating 1 late in Section 1, Div 2 and arriving 1 late in the last competitive.

Car 12, Ross Moir and Ann Thomson had a steady run despite Ann having a sore leg which almost prevented her starting the event. Losing 16 and 14 for a total of 30 and placing 21st and first lady competitor.

Car 13, Hank and Simon Kabel had number 13's luck to nominate 2 early in Div 1, Section 7 and 4 late in Div 2, Section 5; these 6 points dropped them to 6th place. Hank's fine performance shows that there still the running ability in the past Qld Champs and to my mind he was the moral winner of this event.

Second place outright went to Ian Stewart and Murray Coote in a Datsun 180B SSS who cleaned Division 1 and dropped 3 on Division 2.

The Kendore Motors Torana XVI of Gerry Leynolds and Ian Genn starting at No. 16 cleaned the first Division. Gerry must have been tired in the second Division since he dropped 4. Water in the ignition nearly left them in a creek crossing and a large rock which bent the sump guard robbed them of first gear for three-quarters of the event. They ended up a very creditable equal 3rd despite their problems.

Laurie Tindal and Charlie Blake in the Cortina Mk 1 had a steady run to drop a total of 27 and 19th place.

Ruth Tindal and John Blake in the Datsun 1600 didn't start getting warmed up until the last competitive when she and Hank Kabel were the only ones to clean sheet that section. Ruth lost a total of 53 and 22nd place - one place behind Ann Thomson.

Trevor Gynther and Iain Stewart in a Fiat 125 dropped only 1 in the first Division but had problems in Section 1, Div 2 - the navigators section, giving them a total of 19 and 14th place. Their fine performance in the first division shows their strong potential.

Col Reeve-Smith and Hugh Walker in the Datsun 1600 were not up to their usual standard dropping a total of 21 and equal 16th place.

Dennis Brown and Chris Meadows in Car 32, the Pacific Tyre Centre Datsun 180B SSS followed their 3rd place in the Total Mansfield 350 with an excellent equal 3rd on 4 pts lost, one of which was an early penalty. This is definely a crew to watch in the future.

Alan Pryde and Gerard Byrne in the Torana had journeyed down only to be forced to retire after only losing 10 in Div 1.

From 34 starters an almost record 28 cars finished and Gary Elower and Don Saunders should be congratulated and thanked for a fine event.


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
