### ROAD TEST ON THE TOYOTA CELICA LT 2000

The Toyota Celica was released in Australia in 1971, and has been selling like hot cakes ever since. But only early this year, Toyota revised their super sales car. Now in July, Toyota has slipped a new celica on to the market. This model has the new body styling and up dated interior. The new model was released late last month, and the major change from the old model is the boost in engine capacity. change came about so it could meet the ADR 27A Emission Control standard.

Well, of course the engine has been changed from the 1600 mill ENGINE: to the 2000 18R-C single overhead camshaft engine. litre engine has a compression ratio of 8.5 to 1. compared to 9.0 to 1. of the old car. The power is up from 55.9 kw to 61.1 kw but the push comes in the torque range it is up from 115 Nm to 136.9 Nm. This increase has also flattened out the torque curve considerably.

BRAKES: The braking system is the same, with front dics and drums at the rear with standard vacuum servo assistance.

TRANSMISSION: The gear box is identical - the same as the superceded 1600cc version. This now gives a top speed of around 175 km/h. but the big difference comes in the speeds through the gears.

SUSPENSION: The suspension is the same as the previous models. wheelbase has been increased a little bit and the spring ratings have also been increased to take the extra weight...

HANDLING: The Celica was at first quite neutral, then understeers as you put the pressure on, then it neutralises again. With a little extra power you can force the tail out, but even under such circumstances the car is entirely predictable and responsive.

PERFORMANCE: The car is of course faster on the straight line, because of the bigger motor. But the new motor gives a lot more flexibality through the gears. This now makes it an excellent touring car. The clutch had a slight lack of sensitivity, but the gear box was very good.

INTERIOR: The interior is the same as the last model, but it is changed considerably from the original model. The gauges are still well placed, and now the clock is there too. The console is now joined on to the dashboard; this change tidies up this area very well. 200 -

SUMMARY: The Toyota Celica is a much better car than ever before. would not call it a cheap car but it is better value than a lot of other cars on the market today.
