

A Rally Drivers Impression

1981 is for me a year of low key Motor sport - no all out attack on the Queensland Rally Championship as was the case for 1980. Rust Rid made my rallying possible last year and will do again in 1982, but this year is a rest year to fix the house, make the yard less of a jungle and in general catch up on all the things that did not get done last year.

With all this spare time on my hands, the TARA Off Road event seemed like a good thing to fill in a weekend. I could keep in good with Kerrie by taking a picnic lunch and beach unbreilla and have a casual look at Off Road racing - What a mistake that was! This off road stuff looked like really good fun.

Soon after that weekend Kerrie's little Datsun 1200 Ute had had some gas suspension, some old rally tyres all round and all set to go Off Roading. Kerrie was under the impression that all this activety was for her benefit so she could run in the Powder Puff Rally. We made some modifications to the Ute in some places after consultation with Barry (Stub axle) Meller, an off roader from way back and part of my service craw for rallies since 1977. He also was the push behind me to put in an entry for "Purga Creek" because as he said "It is very smooth out there!". More about that later.

The next step was Scrutinearing at Grand Prix there the ute looked very frail and insignificant amongst all these racer things. The most impressive thing about scrutineering was the quantity of tinnies consumed, About three 44 Gallon drams full of empties according to Ross Moir who organized the clean up the next morning. With a rap over the knuckles for a corroded battery class, I was through. Some kind soul offered me his number for the event and Humber 55 was ready to go. By this time Donga (Dave Shannon of Flat fame) had been organized to navigate or what ever and was in attendance at this official point where he found out, to his amazement, that he had to join BSCC if he was to go in the ute in the race.

Because the Powder Puff Rally was wanhed out on its original date, the weekend of "Purga Creek" was rather full. Kerrie drove the ute to a moral victory in the Powder Puff Rally during Saturday night and after we both had about 2 hours sleer. I packed the ute full of jacks, fuel and other necessary gear and headed for Purga Creek. The poor ute never even had a wash in between.

As Donga and I arrived at Purga Creek he was talking about having an up chuck (suffering severely from "too much Medicine" while servicing his good wife in the Powder Puff Rally). Both of us were amazed to see all these arrows in the middle of paddocks of long grass which just had to be hiding stumps. Fortunately, the cattle had eaten some of the arrows which necessitated some hasty course rebuilding by the director. This gave me enough time to put some numbers on the ute and take off the Super Oscars just in time to go to the briefing and then line up for the start.

When I stopped beside Steve Abrahams in his Suzuki to pass the time of day, he seemed hardly able to contain a smile when I informed him that the ute was actually competing. The start procedure for this sport is good. 30 second intervals between cars means you start very soon after the first car. We were fourth last to leave and it only seemed like minutes after Tom Poots blasted off

We spectated at the end of the 'melon holes' long enough to see cars coming through 3 or 4 at a time, they looked like toads hopping down the lawn.

What a buzz; Donga and I are still talking about our one lap at Purga Creek with the enthusiasm Donga usually reserves for descriptions of Fiats. It is a lot different from rallys, but lots of fun. I can see no reason why, with a bit of restraint, rally drivers could not compete off road for a lot of enjoyment without doing any damage to their precious toys. The "melon holes" stand out as the hardest part Of the course for the car. Donga kept complaining about not being able to see the next hole because the bonnet or hood lining were alternately blocking his vision.

that we were away.

Within 30 yards of the start, the poor little ute was airborne. "What have I let muself in for" I thought. Donga had forgotten about up chucking and was busy putting fingernail prints in the dashboard.

Not long after the start I had the feel of things and was starting to have a try when I thought the front wheels had fallen off! Donga put my mind at ease by yelling loudly through the intercom that it was only a drop into a creek.

We then caught up behind the car in front of us. No doubt, he could not hear the utes horn which I was blowing long and loud, because we followed this thing for some two kilometres until I decided we had to pass him without an invitation. Amid much protest from Donga, I got up beside this guy a couple of times before we finally got past, That was worth the entry fee - lots of excitement.

A few kilometres on we thought we had found the legendary "Melon Holes" These melon holes are nothing much to worry about! says Donga, still shouting down the intercom bery loudly. Much to our amazement we found them properly about 2km. further on. The ute nearly did 3 summersaults before it dawned on us that this new experience was the 'real' melon holes. The Subaru on trailer disappeared from our immediate view quite smartly and was out of sight by the time I had the ute landed again. All this was too much for the Datsuns carby and we parked astride some melon holes to wait for the fuel to return to the bottom of the bowl before starting off again at a much reduced page. Rallies are never like this!

The next major obstacle seemed to be a cunning double creek crossing with two creek beds seperated by a knife edge about ten feet high. It had to be ripper because there were large numbers of spectators in attendance. We charged in the first bit to crest the middle to find the creek with a racer parked in about 2 feet of water, no, mud. Much to Dongas releif I managed to flop into the slush beside this stuck racer and not on top of him. After all this excitement the ute lost momentum and did not make the top on the other side. Donga finally extracted his fingernails from the dashboard long enough to get out and help push us up the bank. I am really sorry about the mudbath the boys in the frame must have taken as we arrived beside them in the mud.

About now, once out of the creek, we stopped to look under the bonnet to see why my side of the bonnet was kinked up about 8 inches. Dongas very large sigh of relief suggested we were not going much further. The top of the strut had broken and was trying to get out through the bonnet at every bump. I really wanted to finish one lap at least, so onward and upward. Another four or five kilometres and we were back to the finish, right behind that crazy "Subaru on a trailer" again. After frightening Mr and Mrs Editor in the timing tent (Maving the timing tent on the OUTSIDE of a 90 left wasn't the best - B.E.) by our arrival for our card we retired to the pits to see if we could repair the ute and have another try - NO WAY - no wonder there was so much benging from the front end.

This problem at least gave us a chance to look at some of the other competitors in action and reflect on how we have finished without problems.

Three drivers stand out in my memory as being the main contenders over the next season. Two of them is it turned out came first and second and the other, Rod Brand, was loing wonders in a 1200 frame. I would expect to hear more about him in the future.

With the continued growth in membership of the Brisbane Sporting Car Club, the growing diversity and complexity of the events we are organising, and the increasing workload placed on a small number of voluntary workers within the Club, consideration has been given for some time to the appointment of an Administration Officer. It was felt that by employing someone to do the bulk of the routine work associated with the administration of the Club and the events we run, not only would the routine work be done more efficiently and more promptly, but the task of event organisers would be considerably

The Finance Sub-committee did their homework and at the February Board meeting recommended the appointment of an Administration Officer on a part time basis. This recommendation was adopted by the Board and a small sub-committee was appointed to advertise the position and select a suitable applicant. Thirty-three applications were received and of these sin were colected for interview.

The lady selected for the position was Sue McGarry, and an article written by her appears cloewhere in the Magazine. Ian Bond did a sterling job of constructing an office at the clubrooms on very short notice, and Sue was able to start work on Monday 2nd March. Initially Sue's hours will be from 9.30 am to 2.30 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, but these hours may later be varied as requirements dictate.

Sue is already capably handling a number of functions for the Club including correspondence, typing, printing, and mailing. It is envisaged that she will gradually take over more and more administrative functions, particularly those related to event organisation. For example, typing, nunning off and mailing of Supp Regs, Supp Rogs, entry lists and results, even the typing and running off of night runs, will all be handled by Sue. It should no longer be necessary for any typing or printing work to be done outside the Club.

We have applied for a phone in the office but it may be some time until this is installed. In the meantime please contact the Secretary for any work that is required.

NATIONAL OFF-ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP

The 1981 National Off-Road Championship will consist of the BP sponsored events at Griffith on 19th April. Sea Lake on 7th June, and Goondiwindi on 11th October. Each of 6 classes, viz

Class 1 - Buggies over 1600cc

Class 2 - Buggies 1200cc - 1600cc

Class 3 - Buggies up to 1200cc

Class 4 - Baja WW

Class 5 - AND

Class 6 - Sports and Touring Cars

points will be allocated for 1st - 10th places respectively (20, 15, , 12, 10, 3, 6, 4, 3, 2, 1). In any class in which there are fewer than 10 starters, the points will be reduced - in the case of 8 starters the 1st placed car would be awarded 12 points, etc.

In addition, outright placings from 1st to 6th will be awarded additional points, viz = 5, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 respectively. There will be only one Off Road Champion.

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

1981 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

In the magazine each month you will find an up-to-date list of point scores for the Club Championships. Each month we will explain the scoring system.

In 1981 there will be five seperate championships, as well as an overall Club Championship and a Ladies Championship. The five series will be for motorkhanas, night runs, off-road events, rallies and speed events.

Points may be scored in all BSCC - ORGANISED motorkhanas, night runs, off-road events, rallies and speed events, both open and closed. Points will be allocated in each event only to members who are financial at the time, i.e. to those who have paid their membership subscription at the time of the event. In all events, points will be awarded according to club members' results only, for example if a BSCC member comes 12th outright in an event but this is the best result by a club member that competitor will receive the points for first place, and so on.

Points for the various types of events will be allotted in the following way. For night runs, (long course) off-road events and rallies 11 points for the winner (remembering that 'winner' means best BSCC result), 10 for second, etc., and so on down to 2 points for tenth, and one point for every other finisher. For motorkhanas and speed events - 11 points for first, 10 for second, etc., down to 2 points for tenth. Inall events only outright results will be considered, not class placings.

In the case of a tie, e.g. for third place, both competitors will receive nine points for third place, the next best result will be allotted seven points for fifth place.

Upto two organisers of each event will each receive 9 points for their efforts, however these points can only be gained on two occasions per type of event.

Finally the top ten placegetters in each of the five types of event (motorkhanas, off-road events, night runs, rallies and speed events) will receive a points allocation of 11, 10, 9, 8, etc. in order of their placing (regardless of actual points gained) and all those below tenth will receive one point each. It is this total which will determine the 1981 Club Champion.

The Ladies Championship will be scored on a similar basis, but needless to say, only lady members will be eligible.

Pete Smith (208 1721 home, 379 6182 - work. 15 Laurel Street, Woodridge, Q 4114) has volunteered his services as Registrar again this year, and organisers of all club events are asked (nay demanded) to provide Pete with a copy of the results as soon as possible after the results are compiled to ensure that the pointscores are always as up-to-date as possible.
