



#### COMPETED BEST BRIDGES

AS RECOMMENDED AT THE A.G.M. DETAILS OF THE CO-EFFICIENT SERIES ARE BEING PRINTED IN FULL. A SPECIAL MEETING WILL BE CALLED EARLY IN THE NEW YEAR TO DISCUSS THIS SUBJECT AND OUR FINDINGS FORWARDED TO C.A.M.S.

- 1. Maximum of nine (9) rounds.
- 2. Three (3) Coefficients:-

COMPFICIENT 1 - a) Lowest grade event

b) Points to count as per Qld. Addendum

c) Thase events will, it is envisaged, be

of the following types:-

First time directors First time clubs Organisers who haven't had a good record in the past Clubs who haven't had a good record in the past

d) Generally, these events whould have timing to no less than increments of a 1/4 minute.

e) Generally, these events should not form a round of any other Championship, i.e. Clubsan/Novice but may form part of a Series, i.e. Southern Series and North of the Tropic Series.

COEFFICIENT 2 - a) Middle of the road type event - may have some problems in the past but generally fair organisers/ directors. Basically for organisers/directors who have organised Q.R.C., Open or good closed events in the past.

b) Timing may go to increments of 1 second but this type of event should be considered before granting

automatic approval.

c) This type of event is to be considered a stepping stone to Coefficient 3 events and conversely to Coefficient 1 events.

(5) Points will be as per the Qld. Addendum

with a multiplication factor of 1.5, i.e.

15 x 1.5 = 14 x 1.5 = FIRST SECOND 21.0 THIRD 13 × 1.5 = 19.5 ETC. 15TH 1 x 1.5 m 1.5 0 x 1.5 = 0

e) These events may form part of any Championship or Series, 1.e. Clubman/Novice, Southern Series, North of the Tropic Series.

COEFFICIENT 3 - a) The top events

b) For organisers/directors who have a

proven record of quality

c) The A.R.C. round in Queensland should be included as a round of this A.R.C. as a Coefficient 3 round being the top event in the State in any given year.

d) There would be no necessity to instigate specific prizes/awards in the Qld. A.R.C. round over and above

those already organized.

These events should be automatically recommended for second timing.

f) All regulations for the A.R.C. round of the QR.C. are to take precedence over those of the Q.R.C. where conflict occurs.

Points to be as per the Qld. Addendum 2) with a multiplication factor of 2, e.g.

FIRST 15 x 2 14 x 2 12 13 x 2 26 15TH 1 10 2 2 16TH 0 x 2

It is envisaged that the top Coefficient Round, Coefficient 3 would be the hardest to attain.

It should also be borne in mind that just because a club/director has a Coefficient 3 event one year, that doesn't automatically entitle that club/director to the same Coefficient next year. The RAC is going to have to vet each application for a Q.R.C. round each year and decide its rating based on previous information, including Stewards Reports. Notwithstanding the above, the Qld. Round of the A.R.C. is exempted from this criteria.

It is envisaged that the number of Coefficient 3 rounds should not exceed 3.

The number of Coefficient 2 rounds should not exceed 5.

The number of rounds to count should be as follows :-

Coefficient 3 events - all

Coefficient 2 events - two less than that number allocated excepting that if there are only 3 rounds -

2 count, or less, all count. Coefficient 1 events - At least 1 provided that there is at least 1 round. More if RAC feels there aren't enough rounds of the above Coefficient 2 and 3 events.

If there are only 5 rounds altogether or less, all count.
