


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FROM THE EDITOR

The Mazda 323 that Murray Coote raced; in Group C touring car form for the last couple of seasons is currently being converted to international Group A rally specifications in Murrays workshop.

MAZDA INTO RALLYING

Just as I was wondering what to fill up this space with, I picked up the paper and saw the headlines screaming "Hansford ready for rally assault." Yes, the man with the uncanny knack of being in the right place at the right time, has done it again. At the same time as they announced their withdrawal from circuit racing, (What next for Allan Moffat?) Mazda announced that in 1985 they would enter in the Australian Rally Championship.

And the crew chosen to try and bring the A.R.C. to Queensland for the first time are Gregg Hansford and Dale Payne, both of course are B.S.C.C members. Starting with the first round of the series in Tasmania on April 13/14, Gregg and Dale willcontest all six rounds which for the first time ever are being held in each of the six states. The car they will be using is the familiar Ian Boettcher Motors Mazda RX-7 which has always been competive in Gregg's hands. Later on the team will build another RX-7 this time with a 230hp engine. It seems as though with everyone else who is competitive at a national level driving P.R.C. vehicles, Mazda have realised of the B.S.C.C. I would like to wish Gregg and Dale the best of lack in the championship and lets hope they can bring that trophy up to Queensland for the first time.

(Factory teams now competing in the A.R.C. include Mazda, Honda and the factory supported Subaru teams. Looks as though rallying is on the way back!)

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

THE RIP SNORTER RALLY - ONE COMPETITOR'S VIEWPOINT

After a couple of false starts last year, the Rip Snorter Rally was finally held on the weekend of the 16th-17th March 1985, this being the B.S.C.C.'s first Rally for 1985 (actually it was the first Rally held in Southern Queensland this year apart from Sprints).

The event was mainly the brainchild of Laurie Garth, and was the first map-reading Rally organized by the Club since 1981, and I think the Club's first ever map-reading Rally on Forestry roads, but was modelled on the very successful event run by the N.D.S.C.C. in Toolara Forest for the last three years.

Unfortunately only twenty entries were received, with support from Classified and Recognized drivers noticably lacking. However, as things turned cut, it would possibly not have been a good event if a large number of vehicles were entered.

There are a number of navigators in Oueensland who have had a reasonably amount of experience in map-reading events. This would include Phil McLoughlin, Graham Clark, Tony Best, Tain Stewart and Tike Mitchell. Peter Marshall and Brian Swinton do not do much navigating, but have obviously learned map-reading skills by organizing Rallies. The remaining navigators competing were generally route-chart navigators or complete novices. The results showed a big gap between the two groups.

Hod Browning was the only Classified driver entered, and there were no Recognized drivers and only a handful of Clubmen, so the majority of the filed were Novices. The Organisers stressed the fact that the event was suitable for road cars not prepared for Rallies, and provided a Class for this type of vehicle. (I agree that it would have been possible for an unprepared car to negotiate the course, but certainly not at anything approaching rallying speeds). One very game competitor was Steven Grant who entered an Austin Healey Sprite. Another interesting entry was Peter and Jan Wickham in the family Alfa Romeo. Peter was Queensland Motorkhana Champion in 1968, and won a round of the Q.R.C. in 1975 and another in 1976, but has done virtually no rallying since 1976.

The plotting and map-reading could certainly not have been classed as really difficult. All roads used were as shown on the maps but some were hard to see, and no competitor had a trouble free run. Almost everybody got bogged in the sand at least once during the event. The sand was no problem to competitors if they kept moving, but if they missed a turn, had to reverse back, and then had to go forwards and/or turn the havigator often had to get out and push!

There were a few complaints about the Cautions. On a route-chart Rally a navigator can warn the driver of a Caution up to a kilometre ahead, whereas on a mapped Rally the first thing a driver knows of a Caution is when he sees a triangle. Consequently any driver who treated the event as a road race sustained some vehicle damage. A further problem is that if a driver is off course but does not know it, there are absolutly no markers to indicate the hazards. Steve Reid from the Gold Coast had this happen, and hit an unseen ditch at considerable speed on an off-course road. Fortunately they were able to walk and were not far from the correct course. It is hard

to imagaine what could be done if anybody had been seriously injured in an off-course accident. (Incidentally Mr. Reid must be one of the keenest competitors in Queensland. The weekend before the Rip Snorter he was competing in the first round of the Queensland Motorkhana Championship, and the weekend before that he was competing in the first round of the Holland Park Rally sprint Series, all in the same car).

There were also a few organizational problems. The event had been set with only six competitive Forestry sections. On the fourth section the leading cars caught the Zero Car, and the field was held up for a while. The fifth Section had obviously been zeroed very quickly and had virtually no cautions marked, and no V.R.C.'s. The sixth Section was deleted when it was realized that it would be impossible to set up the Section without holding the field for 1 or 3 hours. This was the longest section, almost a third of the competitive distance, so this resulted in a considerably shortened event. Another problem was that the Sweep Car had not calculated Late Time correctly and closed down some of the Controls before some competitors arrived at them.

The event was won by Rod Browning and Iain Stewart the only Classified Crew entered. The next three places were filled by Novices.

However the classification system for Rallies of this type obviously needs some changing when Graham Clark, Tony Best and Peter Marshall are classed as novice navigators! The unluckiest crew in the event was John Gibson/Phil McLoughlin, who had a sizeable lead up till the last competitive section, and then became stuck on a bank for over an hour.

Many thanks to Laruie Garth and his helpers for the event, and specially to Alan Clunes and his crew who had been up since 4.30 on the morning of the event marking out the course, and were still working after midnight.

Despite the fact that this Report perhaps concentrates on the problems I personally thought it was a good event. Before the event Laurie said it could become an annual event if it was a success. Despite the low entries and the other problems I feel there is a place on the Pally Calendar for an event such as this one, and I hope it is on again in 1986.

One very enjoyable part of the event was the trophy presentation at Laurie Garth's house (which coincided with Laurie's 40th birthday), a good social get-together of competitors and officials which is something missing from many events these days.

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
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B.S.C.C. CHAMPIONSHIPS

IN THE MAGAZINE EACH MONTH YOU WILL FIND AN UP-TO-DATE LIST OF POINT SCORES FOR THE CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP. EACH MONTH WE WILL EXPLAIN THE SCORING SYSTEM.

THERE WILL BE FIVE SEPERATE CHAMPIONSHIPS, AS WELL AS AN OVERALL CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP AND A LADIES CHAMPIONSHIP. THE FIVE SERIES WILL BE MOTORKHANAS, NIGHT RUNS, OFF-ROAD EVENTS, RALLIES AND SPEED EVENTS.

POINTS MAY BE SCORED IN ALL B.S.C.C. ORGANISED MOTORKHANAS, NIGHT RUNS, OFF-ROAD EVENTS, RALLIES AND SPEED EVENTS, BOTH OPEN AND CLOSED, POINTS WILL BE ALLOCATED IN EACH EVENT ONLY TO MEMBERS WHO ARE FINANCIAL AT THE TIME, I.E. TO THOSE WHO HAVE PAID THEIR MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION AT THE TIME OF THE EVENT. IN ALL EVENTS, POINTS WILL BE AWARDED ACCORDING TO CLUB MEMBERS RESULTS ONLY, FOR EXAMPLE, IF A BSCC MEMBER COMES 1/ OUTRIGHT IN AN EVENT BUT THIS IS THE BEST RESULT FOR A CLUB MEMBER, THAT COMPETITOR WILL RECEIVE THE POINTS FOR FIRST PLACE, AND SO ON.

POINTS FOR THE VARIOUS TYPES OF EVENTS WILL BE ALLOTTED IN THE FOLLOW-ING WAY; FOR NIGHT RUNS, (LONG COURSE) OFF-ROAD EVENTS AND RALLIES; I POINTS FOR THE WINNER (REMEMBERING THAT WINNER MEANS BEST BSCC RESUL TO FOR SECOND ETC., DOWN TO 2 POINTS FOR TENTH AND I POINT FOR ALL BSCC FINISHERS THEREAFTER. FOR MOTORKHANAS AND SPEED EVENTS POINTS WILL ONLY BE AWARDED DOWN TO 2 POINTS FOR TENTH PLACE. IN ALL EVENTS ONLY OUT-RIGHT RESULTS WILL BE CONSIDERED, NOT CLASS PLACINGS.

IN CASE OF A TIE, E.G. FOR THIRD PLACE, BOTH COMPETITORS WILL RECEIVE NINE POINTS FOR THIRD PLACE, THE NEXT BEST RESULTS WILL BE ALLOTTED SEVEN POINTS FOR FIFTH PLACE.

UP TO TWO ORGANISERS OF EACH EVENT WILL EACH RECEIVE 9 POINTS FOR THEIR EFFORTS, HOWEVER, THESE POINTS CAN ONLY BE GAINED ON TWO OCCASIONS PER TYPE OF EVENT.

FINALLY THE TOP TEN-PLACEGETTERS IN EACH OF THE FIVE TYPES OF EVENTS (MOTORKHANAS, OFF-ROAD EVENTS, NIGHT RUNS, RALLIES AND SPEED EVENTS) WILL RECEIVE A POINTS ALLOCATION OF 11, 10, 9, 8 ETC.IN ORDER OF THEIR PLACING (REGARDLESS OF ACTUAL POINTS GAINED) AND ALL THOSE BELOW TENTH WILL RECEIVE ONE POINT EACH, IT IS THIS TOTAL WHICH WILL DETERMINE THE CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP.

THE LADIES CHAMPIONSHIP WILL BE SCORED ON A SIMILAR BASIS, BUT NEEDLESS TO SAY, ONLY LADY MEMBERS WILL BE ELIGIBLE.

PETER SMITH (379 2066 HOME, 379 6182 WORK 42 ARDOYNE ROAD CORINDA, 0.4075) HAS VOLUNTEERED HIS SERVICES AS REGISTRAR AGAIN THIS YEAR AND ORGANISERS OF ALL CLUB EVENTS ARE ASKED (NAY DEMANDED) TO PROVIDE PETER WITH A COPY OF THE RESULTS AS S ON AS POSSIBLE AFTER THE RESULTS ARE COMPILED TO ENSURE THAT THE POINTSCORES ARE ALWAYS AS UP TO DATE AS POSSIBLE.

Since its inception in 1978, the CIBIE/GP CARS Rally Series for NOVICE / CLUBMAN (grades 3 and 4) has become tradition as far as Q*ld rallying goes .

Sponsored by John Holdsworth Automotive Lighting Coy, the Sydney based CIBIE importer together with their Q*ld distributor GP CARS in Brisbane, the Series has been successful in achieving its goal — to encourage rallying at the Novice/Clubman level, giving competitors a goal to aim for as they move up the ladder. A number of drivers has emerged from these ranks to become leading drivers in recent years. Peter Phillips and , Peter Marcovich have both been State Champions. Warren Tegg, winner of the 1982 Series and runner—up the same year Dale Payne, both proved themselves in later events including QRC rallies before swapping seats to ride beside two of Q*ld*s leading drivers, Denis Brown and Gregg Hansford respectively.

No doubt there will be further talent to emerge such as Ian Reddiex, the 1984 winner and the first Grade four driver to win the series. Reddiex is the son of former World Cup winner and London to Sydney marathon international, 'gentleman' Jim Reddiex.

The 1985 Series should again prove popular with the competitors. A boost in prizemoney and awards could see the winner collect \$925 in cash and product awards, however to do so must win all of the four rounds.

Whereas in the past one or two rounds of each years Series has been run in conjunction with QRC rallies, this years format will change. It will be conducte with all rounds of the QRC except the ARC event in July, which will double as a round of the State Championship. This illustrates the acceptance of the Series by the organizers and directors of the premier events, and no doubt will provide full fields throughout the year. First round of the 85 Q*ld Rally Championship and CIBIE/GP CARS Series is the Currie Motors of Bundamba Rally organised by Ipswich West Moreton Auto Club and directed by Tony Best. Final and fifth round scheduled is the KEEMA CLASSIC Rally, 30th November.

JOHN HOLOSWORTH TROPHIES:

Beginning this year, two more awards for the Q'ld rally competitors to aim for will be the JOHN HOLDSWORTH trophies. Both the State Champion driver and navigator will be presented with a trophy each year, in recognition of the late John Holdsworth.

Provided by the CIBIE/GP CARS combination, these trophies are a fitting tribute to a man who put a lot into the sport of rallying by way of sponsorship, not just in Q'ld but also in other states, at all levels. Rather than sponsor the individual, it was John's desire to help promote rallies by sponsoring an event or series, and in particular at Clubman or State level.

It is expected this policy will continue in the future of Q'ld rallying.

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
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
