

BELATED PRESIDENT'S REPORT

First of all I must apologize for my absence at the A.G.M. but those of you who attended will know that I was delayed in France.

My business commitment is the reason I am not standing for a 3rd year as President which was my intention when I was elected nearly 2% years ago. I guess, like most retiring Presidents I am disappointed with the acheivement of the club during my term. Membership, although riding an all time high of 500 has dropped back to a fairly static 450-460 by the end of each year.

The ever increasing costs of maintaining our property and equiptment has to be faced and if we can't afford to keep our administration officer it will be a sad day for the club. Our fees are considerably higher than other clubs and in the present economic climate we have

done well to maintain our numbers.

We finished the year in a fairly strong financial position which is comforting but we have some major capital expenditure items coming up such as some new chairs for the clubrooms and a badly needed paint job outside.

What the club needs is an income producing property e.g. a building with rooms upstairs and a couple of shops or offices downstairs for rent. Also one big event a year that we could charge admittance for would be a great help. Now that we have a little money behind us I believe we are in a position to start considering some venture.

One of my aims was to improve the image of the B.S.C.C. in the eyes of other clubs and improve co-operation between ourselves and other clubs. To a point I believe we have had some success in this area but

being the biggest club we will always be the whipping post.

The board has been discussing and implementing a change of direction for the club in respect to events that we organize. Over the last few years we seem to have been promoting bigger and bigger events to the detriment of smaller club events and we intend to get back to some low budget events which carry little or no prize money but will be relatively short, easier and cheaper to organize and give us a training base for event directors etc.

I think the biggest disappointment for me during my presidency is the drop off in club room attendances on Wednesday nights. It's one of the few times your board members get to listen to the opinions of the members and to get a feeling of what members want. This problem is high on the list of your new President.

To the members of the outgoing board I offer my sincere thanks and appreciation for your support. To those re-elected and the new board

members my appreciation for your participation.

It was indeed good news to hear that a ballot had to be held to select the board members. I hope those who were unsuccessful don't fade

away but resolve to get there next year.

To Brian Swinton I wish him every success. If energy and hard work are the requirements then Brian is sure to succeed. The club's greatest asset without a doubt is our administration officer Esme Gibson. If we doubled her wages we still wouldn't be paying half her worth. Anybody who has organized anything for the club will know of the tremendous support that Esme and in fact the whole Gibson family gives. Thank you Esme.

In conclusion I would like to congratulate all the club champions on there efforts . Also thanks to Ray and Betty Melton for the trophy donated by them to perpetuate the memory of their son and our club member Lin Melton who left us last year to rally around the heavens.

CURRIE MOTORS OF BUNDAMBA RALLY

Organized by the Ipswich West Moreton Auto Club the Currie Motors was the first round of the 1985 Queensland Rally Championship. The event started off with spectator stages at Collingwood Park, Willowbank and Amberly and continued on up to Esk then finally to the night stages in the Benarkin- Yarraman area. Entries included four former Q.L.D. rally champions, Peter Phillips, Murray Coote, Henk Kabel and Marc Roach.

Murray was debuting his new Mazda 323 P.R.C. car as was Henk with his Mazda RX7 which is also a P.R.C. car. This event also marked the debut of the new seeding list which will be used throughout 1985.

On the way to the start at Currie Motors it was obvious that this was going to be the first wet rally in a while although it turned out to be not as wet as some competitors thought it was going to be.

Two stages had to be cancelled after the Zero car got bogged, one of those stages was 52 km and the other 20 odd km so the competitive distance was shorted considerably. After the briefing at the IWMAC clubrooms the cars travelled back to Collingwood Park for Special Stage 2 and this was a fairly rough section but with a lot of spectators.

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

R.I.P. - OVERDRAUGHT II

It is with deep regret that we announce the passing of Baja 444, fonaly known as "OVERDRAUGHT II" by Mr. & Mrs. Nev (Tie Rod) Taylor, their three children and their Bank Manager,

Overdraught II was just one of the several "deceased" and many "casualties" of the Easter Off-Road toll at the first round of the National Championships at Dubbo, N.S.W.

The official cause of death, following an autopsy, is written on the Death Certificate as "Being Airborne for only 14 feet over a 16 foot gully".

Vital organs have been salvaged for inclusion in "OVERDRAUGHT III", which is scheduled for it's first public appearance at the Kooralbyn Short Course. The body was put to rest at Strathpine tip following a private ceremony attended by close family, and a weeping Bank Manager.

Of the race itself there is little to say, other than the fact that less than 40 of the original 183 entrants finished the course.

For Lucensland, Ken Smith and the little White Susuki saved the day with a 1st in 4WD class. Well done Ken on a fine effort on such a rough track.

Also, the Jeffery's Baja limped into a 3rd in class. A great effort that kept the Queensland flag flying.

The recovery vehicles did a fantastic job.

Once again Linua Miller finished the race. For consistency Linda and new Navigator, Catny, take the cake.

I stand corrected, but I think she has been classed as a finisher in every event she has started in. A wonderful job that is really appreciated by her Sponsors.

The "Flying Grasshopper" of Steve Hilton was another Queensland finisher. Steve's navigator (his brother) did a fine job of direction by putting him over the same 8 foot embankment 4 out of the 5 loops they completed. Steve says he had to suddenly swerve to the left to miss a kangaroo on the fifth loop and found himself on the right track instead of going over the embankment.

Ed van Amstel almost had to hire an extra trailer to bring back the large pile of broken shock absorbers he experienced. He has since changed brands. The late stop press tells me that Ed's wife, Linda, crossed the line in front of him at the recent Goondiwindi event. As a result of this fatal mistake by Linda, it is reported that Ed has withdrawn conjugal rites for one month.

I think there were 17 entrants at Dubbo from Queensland, of which we had a result of one 1st in class, one 3rd in class and 3 other finishers.

The casualties are too numerous to list, besides it would be painful for them to read about it.

Although we only did 2% loops in "OVERDRAUGHT II", it was a memorable race. First off we only got 100 yards into the prologue and stopped with a fuel blockage. We started off on the first loop seeded No. 43, went 20 kilometres and ripped out a brake line. The next 60 km at race speed, back to the pits without brakes and dragging 10 feet of fence behind us, I will remember for a very long time.

After the pit crew fixed the car and we changed underpants, we took off on the 2nd loop to break an accelerator cable of all things, 200 yards after the start. Back to the pits, a new cable and off again.

Joy of joys, a complete 2nd loop without problems.

Through the pits and into the third 80 km loop. Nev had the bit between his teeth and was out to make up lost time. I missed the "CAUTION" sign lying on the ground, and the result you read about at the beginning.

The "IF ONLY" stories and post mortems have been conducted and I dare say we will all approach Kempsey with positive thoughts in our minds of victory.

The trials and tribulations of Dubbo will be forgotten, and thats offroading. If we dwelt on the failures we would never prepare the vehicle for the next race.

As Nev said last week while we were working on "OVERDRAUGHT III", "I think I'll wear a tie on stage when I collect my cheque at Kempsey".

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
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
