The other was in Queensland at the Surfers Paradise Raceway when a young 22 year old from Canberra, Robin Schorn died after his car went

off the circuit and hit the safety fence at high speed.

It seems as though both of these accidents were caused not from a mechanical failure or interference but simply driver error. A split second decision that turned out to be the wrong one and the penalty was the loss of life. Both drivers trying just that little bit too hard to beat the other guy. Although we are fortunate in Rallying and Off Roading in Australia in having very few serious accidents let's not ignore the dangers associated with our sport. The cars nowdays are becoming more and more powerful in all areas of the sport and consequently when something goes wrong it happens much faster and much more violently.

Although no safety regulations were ignored or broken in either of the accidents mentioned above that doesn't mean they still shouldn't be strictly adhered to. I think a lot of us take safety a little bit too lightly considering the speed of our vehicles today. I'd like to use a

quote from a well known T.V. show that goes,

#### "HEY, Let's be careful out there."

On a cheerier note I hope you appreciated the column in the mag last month by our new (hopefully regular) columnist Tufus Ghötznees.

I beleive "Tuf" (as his friends call him) used to once upon a time navigate for Hurd Glubertash back in Latvia but he doesn't talk about ze old days much. Of course Hurd is now a member of the works Lada team and is a regular winner in the Latvian Rally Championship. Tuf will be keeping you up to date on any motorsport that he views on the idiot box.

Which reminds me. Did you see the telecast of Indianapolis on Channel 9 the other week. It reminded me of another quote I once heard .

"There are only two things Americans are good at. Hotel Management and Self Congratulation" We know the guys are brave but do they have to keep telling us every 5 minutes.



#### NEW RULES

In 1987 new regulations concerning Group B Rally Cars will come into effect. The most important new rule will be the one with regards to the equivalence formula for turbocharged cars . The formula has been changed from a multiplication factor of 1.4 to a factor of 1.7 which will move the Peugeot 205, Audi Sport Quattro and Ford RS200 up in class. The Peugeot and Ford will go. into the under 3.5 Litre class which has a minimum weight limit of 1045 kg. The Peugeot currently runs in the under 2.5 Litre class which has a minimum weight limit of 890 kilos and the Ford when we see it later in the year will run in the under 3 Litre class which has a limit of 960 kilos. The maximum rim width will also be changed from the current 11 inches to 10 inches. These rule changes are generally seen as a way to slow down the speeds of the current bunch of supercars which are now putting out somewhere in the region of 500 bhp. The Audi will go up into the over 3.5 Litre class which will see it have to weigh in at a minimum of 1100 kilos compared to its current 960. The car never got down to that weight anyway and I think that by the time the changes come into effect they will make very little differance to the performances of all the Group B rockets.

#### B.S.C.C. GOES VISUAL

These club members who have been to the clubrooms on the last couple of Wednesday nights will have noticed that the club is now equipped with a Video Recorder and T.V. On the night of the 29th of April a Castrol produced film of the 1984 Rally of the 1000 Lakes was shown. I think that all those members who saw the film would have been as impressed as I was with the speeds and skill shown by the drivers who are now competing in the World Rally Championship. In fact to watch those cars cornering on the limit is mind boggling. The Peugeot in particular was spectacular as it slid around the corners in 4 wheel drifts. The Toyotas and Nissans were nothing short of frightening as the drivers tried to cope with 350 odd bhp through the rear wheels only. The men who I have the most respect for I think are the co-drivers (as they are called Over There.) . They must really have nerves of steel to be driven around at that speed and especially with the hordes of suicidal spectators literally on the road up until the last possible second. Unreal. We also got to see the 1983 Dunlop 2G0 which starred Denis Brown, Peter Marcovich and Murray Coote among various International and Southern drivers. On one Very Hard Right corner where there was a lot of spectators the Japanese driver Kamioka. stopped with carby trouble for about 30 seconds. Just as he was about to get back into his car we heard a chorus of "WhadawethinkaKamioka......He's allright" which was almost certainly sung by the B.S.C.C. Spectator Point Choir. The Off Road fans also got some entertainment with a video of the Archerfield Off Road Spectacular . The racing was very close with heaps of passing manouvers being well executed and some which were not so well done the result usually being a biff in the side for someone. The big powerful 4WD's wouldn't have pulled third gear but their entertainment value trying to get around the tight corners made up for their lack of top speed. The video machine is avaiable to all members so if you have any kind of motorsport on video that you would like to share with everyone else bring it along on a Wednesday night. The machine is a V.H.S. model.

Hendrickson retired at the end of Section 21 with altenater problems and this gave the lead over to Phillips. Also up to this point we've lost Geoff Keys, Simon Passlow, Bill Keeley, Peter Graham, Tony Gray, and Phil McLoughlin. Lisle Neumann is going well in 2nd O/R as is Kevin Harvey in 6th O/R.

It was about this time that the organisers had to do some more re-routing and therewas a bit of a wait at Benarkin which gave competitors some extra time to make repairs etc. for the final three sections. Tom picked up our instructions and of we headed on a 16km transport toward Yarraman. At the spot where our Halda said there should be a TR there wasn't one but there was one about 100 metres back down the road. So I pulled off to the left to turn around and all of a sudden a Police Car stopped in front of me preventing me from moving forward. 





IN ALL EVENTS, POINTS WILL BE AWARDED ACCORDING TO CLUB MEMBERS RESULTS ONLY, FOR EXAMPLE, IF A BSCC MEMBER COMES I/ OUTRIGHT IN AN EVENT BUT THIS IS THE BEST RESULT FOR A CLUB MEMBER, THAT COMPETITOR WILL RECEIVE THE POINTS FOR FIRST PLACE, AND SO ON.

POINTS FOR THE VARIOUS TYPES OF EVENTS WILL BE ALLOTTED IN THE FOLLOW-ING WAY; FOR NIGHT RUNS, (LONG COURSE) OFF-ROAD EVENTS AND RALLIES; POINTS FOR THE WINNER (REMEMBERING THAT WINNER MEANS BEST BSCC RESULT) TO FOR SECOND ETC., DOWN TO 2 POINTS FOR TENTH AND 1 POINT FOR ALL BSCC FINISHERS THEREAFTER. FOR MOTORKMANAS AND SPEED EVENTS POINTS WILL ONLY BE AWARDED DOWN TO 2 POINTS FOR TENTH PLACE. IN ALL EVENTS ONLY OUT-RIGHT RESULTS WILL BE CONSIDERED, NOT CLASS PLACINGS.

IN CASE OF A TIE, E.G. FOR THIRD PLACE, BOTH COMPETITORS WILL RECEIVE NINE POINTS FOR THIRD PLACE, THE NEXT BEST RESULTS WILL BE ALLOTTED SEVEN POINTS FOR FIFTH PLACE.

THE LADIES CHAMPIONSHIP WILL BE SCORED ON A SIMILAR BASIS, BUT NEEDLESS TO SAY, ONLY LADY MEMBERS WILL BE ELIGIBLE.




