



EXTRACTfrom CAMS REPORT - MARCH 1988

"OFF ROAD COMPETITION NUMBERS

The system of permanent numbers for Off Road competition has been modified slightly. The numbers which competitors presently have will indeed be their permanent numbers. Any number which is not used for competition during 1988 will lapse and will thus be available. There is NO NEED for Off Road competitors to submit an application for their number in 1988, nor indeed in subsequent years, provided they compete.

The winners of the Championship classes will be permitted to use the No.1 (101, 201 etc.) Their permanent number will remain reserved for them for as long as they are champion, which means that they may then revert to that number should they not be the champion in the following year."

HERE COMES THE (SPORTS) "JUDGE"

As sport becomes more and more professional -both in terms of money and of approach - recourse to protests and the charging of competitors with breaches of the rules is becoming more and more common

In sports such as yachting hoisting the protest flag is a fact of life and all of us are used to footballers fronting a judiciary committee or tribunal after the weekend's games.

However, sports which in disciplinary and appeal terms have had it easy are now linding that they, too, are part of this same syndrome and consequently more and more sports administrators and senior sportsmen and women are finding themselves sitting on a tribunal and exercising a judicial power and function.

For everyone involved this is a great responsibility and often a major worry to tribunal members.

Am I doing the right thing?

Can I be hauled into a court if I make a mistake?

Does it matter if I know him or her? I

These and similar questions are common and very sensible.

At the risk of trying to over simplify an area which volumes have been written about, there are some straightforward quidelines which tribunal members should observe, and if they do they won't go too far wrong.

These can be summed up as follows:

f Observe the rules

It might seem obvious, but nevertheless it happens too often that a sport's own rules and procedures are not

If the rules say, for example, that an appeal must be lodged within 24 hours - with no provision for an extension - then an appeal lodged at 36 hours is a nullity.

2 Disinterest

Tribunal members must not have an interest in the affair, e.g., as fellow competitors.

They must be independent and if they are sitting, for example, to hear an appeal from an official decision at an event, normally they should not have been officials at that event themselves.

3. Lack of bias

They must be unbiased and unprejudiced.

In the often small confines of a sport it is occasionally inevitable that tribunal members and those before them will know each other.

This is not in itself a ground for tribunal members to disqualify themselves.

However, minds must be kept open and conclusions not drawn until all the evidence has been heard

It is also important to know that the law applies a test known as "reasonable suspicion of bias".

If a tribunal member, who may in fact be unbiased, could reasonably be thought or be expected to be biased that is enough for he or she to be required to step down.

4. Natural justice

A party facing some penalty or consequence is entitled to know the charge or possible consequence, to hear and test the evidence against him or her and to present his or her own case and evidence.

This is a fundamental precept of our Common Law system.

Brought down to basics these requirements are probably - and hopefully - no more than a fair minded tribunal would impose on itself through its own common sense and fair play.

Remember that no judge pleases everbody all the time, but the consistent application of a fair and open minded approach within the formal framework required will produce enormous respect for the sport and for those who serve it on its tribunals.

There is an old legal maxim which says it all:

"Justice must not only be done but must be seen to be done"




