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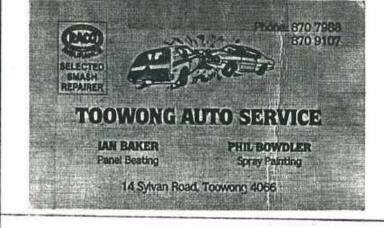


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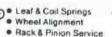
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The Australian Rally Championship for 1989 has now reached the half-way point, with three of the six rounds being completed.

The third round was the BP Visco Forest Rally held on the first weekend in June. There were a total of thirty-eight entries, of which thirty were locals and eight were from interstate, as it was almost like a round of the local Rally Championship with a few interstate entries.

Half of the eight non-WA competitors were from Queensland. These were Murray Coote/Iain Stewart, Geoff Keys/Bill Thurley, and George Kahler/myself, all in Mazdas and David Johansen in his Nissan Gazelle. David Johansen had a local navigator, but David Ambrose also came over from Queensland to navigate for Adrian Taylor. In fact Adrian has also lived and rallied in Queensland for a number of years, so could almost be classed as an ex-Queenslander.

The fact that the round of the World Rally Championship will be held in WA later this year probably resulted in some of the Eastern States competitors deciding that two trips to the West were a bit much for one year.

The Rally was of only two days duration (Tasmania and the Alpine were three day events, as will be our Round, the Rally Queensland and the Esanda Rally in Camberra). However it was still quite a long event, starting at 9 a.m. on the Saturday and finishing at 4 p.m. on the Sunday and running fairly late on the Saturday night.

and was expected to do the same in the third round, but he did not completely have things his own way, not early in the event anyway.

Local driven Rob Herridge in a Subaru led the event early on and my have won if he had not had problems with his car late on the Saturday afternoon. Herridge possibly had the advantage of local knowledge, and the roads in WA certainly appear to suit the Subarus, but he is still a very talented driver. Actually there is quite a bit of talent in the West. John Macara (also in a Subaru) was almost as quick as Herridge, Bob Nicoli does amazing things in a Daihatsu Charade, Clive Slater is still very competitive in his Starion, and there were a couple of almost-new Mazdas driven by Tolley Challis and Frank Johnson (Johnson was the oldest driver, in the event with experience dating back to the London-to-Sydney and early Southern Cross Rallies).

Ross Dunkeston was only spectating. I think it is a great pity that Kunkeston and Geoff Portman are not regular ARC competitors, not to mention George Fury.

Like almost all of the rest of the country, WA had a fair bit of rain leading up to the event, as the roads were a bit rough and wet, but at least there was no doubt. With the retirement of Herridge the result was fairly predictable, the first three places going to Carr, Coote, and South Australian Ed Ordinski in his Mitsubishi Galant (the same finishing order as in the Alpine). This Galant is an amazing vehicle. It was in Group N trim and looks like a road car with a roll cage. it does not even sound particularly noisy. There is a lot of scope for development, and without too much effort Mitsubishi could considerably reduce the cars weight, and presumably get a lot more power also.

The next three placegetters were West Australian crews, John Macara, Adrian Taylor, and Frank Johnson. We managed seventh place, followed by Geoff Keys. Tolley Challis was next, and then David Johansen made it four Queenslanders in the top ten, and David's best ARC result and a win in the two litre class. Retirements included Nicoli, Slater, and the Tolcher's Subaru.

The over two litre class was contested by local RX7s, and the 1600cc class had mainly Corollas entered. The 1300cc class was won by a Honda Civic, but the number of Datsun 1200s was quite noticeable, obviously a good way of getting started in rallying on a low budget.

I am glad we decided to have a go at the ARC this year, considering the amount of rallying that has not been happening in Queensland. With a fifth place in the Alpine and a seventh in WA we would be well up in the pointscore if we had not retired in Tasmania. (We had a few computer box problems in WA also, but this time we had contingency plans that we were able to put into effect - the whole story is a bit complicated to explain in a short article).

The organisation of the event was very good and the local officials and competitors were very helpful and I have made more friends with every trip to WA and am looking forward to the World Championship Round in September.

So far there have only been six cars that have competed in every round of the ARC, half of these are from Queensland (the three Coote-prepared Mazdas, Carr's Lancia, the Tolchers' Subaru, and Adrian Taylors Ford Sierra).

Last year Queensland won the Interstate Challenge Shield. This year we could do it again except that Greg Carr has been classed as coming from NSW whereas we all know he comes from ACT. South Australia could be the other State that may worry us, particularly in their home event, in fact by the time this article is printed we should be in South Australia competing in the fourth round of the Championship, and hopefully continuing the good results that Queensland news have so far shown this year.

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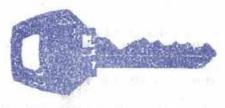
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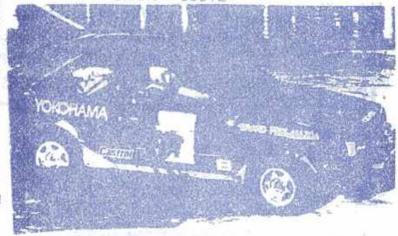

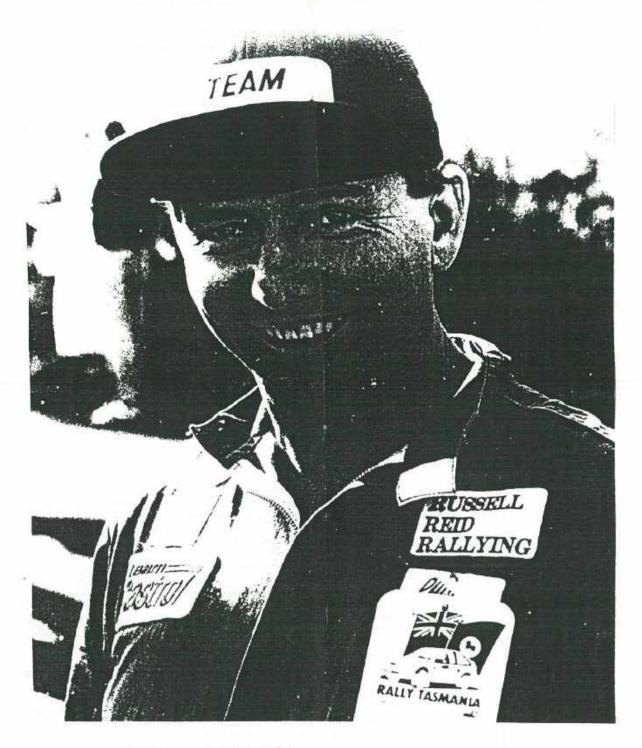
