

By next month I should be able to relate to readers a summary of the events surrounding the final ARC Round in Coffs Harbour.



BAILEY POWERLINES RALLY 1990

"Holy Mackerel, I thought these first-time out rally drivers were supposed to take things easy until they knew just what they were doing!" Those were my thoughts during the first 350 metres of the first competitive section of the recent Bailey Powerlines Rally, held in Beerburrum on the weekend of 6/7 October.

Sitting alongside Alan Bates in the ex-Ron Burns Corolla, I figured that he would take a little time to adjust and then maybe speed up in the latter half of the event.

Not so! The bugger had been foxing. Talk about one of the dark horses of the Rally. In the first stage we went fairly quickly and then maintained that pace for the rest of the night, despite a couple of moments and one particularly beaut spin.

The reward for Alan's efforts was a great 10th outright and first in the Absolute Beginners Class - a fine debut event.

Actually the rally was a raging success. When we, the Rally Sub-Committee decided to stage the Bailey Powerlines Rally again, the question was "Where will we put it?" The answer was simple. Instead of going even further afield and surveying a completely new forest, John Goes-to-Googly suggested that we utilise the forest that we had on our doorstep. Good old Beerburrum.

The Forestry people seemed happy for us to use the roads and a course was duly set, gathering up some 55 km of competitive roads.

As you all know by now, the Director's hat went to Neal Wesche who did a fine job and has also threatened to make himself available for next time.

There was a very encouraging field of 41 starters, of which some thirteen were street cars. The field of Rally Cars included some very fast combinations including Richard 'Wombat' Anderson in his 'Alfa NOOSA', Turbo-Dick Boardman in his 300hp Cordia, Greg Sommerville's 4WD Subaru and Mal Clarke in his 120Y Grunter.

If anything, the forest was looking a little dusty in the week preceding the event and setting up on the Saturday afternoon was hot and thirsty work. Then by divine providence, the traditional Bailey Powerlines Rally Thunderstorm hit about 2 hours before the start. This settled the dust and made the roads extremely driveable, bringing the pace of the rally up a couple of notches overall.

Using the fantastic rest point on the old Bruce Highway at Beerwah for a Headquarters the event started on a high with everybody in good spirits.

Director Neal of the Wesche's gave the pre-rally speech and told all of the new competitors the hard word about VRC's and booking-in and all that stuff.

The great thing about this event was the use of a smallish-red non-descript arrow, well arrows. And these arrows were literally everywhere. John had a notion that these arrows would be a good idea and the final opinion is a big fat "YES"!

The middle part of the field looked like a re-make of "Young Guns" with all of the BSCC's up and coming rallyists starring: You had your Glen Weston, Paul Pyyvaara, Paul and Shaun Gray, Brett-ski Wright, Robin Berardo and a particularly potent combination in the form of Ian 'Creshless' Bremner and Martin Gibson.

These guys were all part of the next generation of rally drivers and were out for a good time on the night.

As the event progressed, Richard and nav. Phil O'Callaghan followed the arrows and started stretching their lead. By the service break they had established a clean break and had even cleaned one section (something that wasn't supposed to have happened.)

Unfortunately one of the stages in the second half of the rally had to be deleted, and that stage 'Black Rock' at 4km was also very fast indeed. The field was transported over it and continued on to a re-run of 'Tibrogargan' to finish the night.

The 'Control of the Rally' award went to the End of Section on that stage manned by Iain Stewart, Rod and Sharon Browning and Suzie Scullin, amongst others.

The surprise was the negligees and make-up that Stewie and Rod were wearing, but a hot and lusty, sorry, dusty Rally crew still manages to notice a great set of (false) norks.

Unlike previous events, this time everyone cleared out and headed for home straight after the rally had finished, leaving only some of the organising committee there to clean up after the fun.

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


CAMS WISHES ALL AFFILIATED MEMBERS TO NOTE THE AUSTRALIAN BODY'S STAND IN THIS MATTER.

QSC NEWS

Due to popular demand, I have decided to include a page (or part thereof) every month dedicated to items of interest which may be seen in the "Queensland State Council" News which is a magazine type issue put out by out governing body CAMS.

For the month of September, the following items have appeared which you may be keen on:

(1) The National Rally Committee has resolved at a meeting on 1/2 September to seek the opinion of members of the Sport in respect of reduction in the duration of Australian Rally Championship events from 1992 onwards to 40 hours. Current regulations stipulate a 60 hour duration. It feels that this could result in considerable cost savings without adversely affecting the 'commercial quotient' of the series.

Any submissions on this matter should be directed to Bruce Keys at CAMS.

(2) National Rally Committee has recommended the following calendar for 1991:

26/28 April	ARC-2	Victoria
16/19 May	Southern Cross Rally	N.T.

- (3) The Qld Rally Advisory Panel recommended to State Council at it's meeting of 3 September that the points allocated for QRC-2 (Tweed City Rally) be deleted from the Qld Rally Championship Scores for all competitors.
- (4) Rally Panel recommended that all Start Controls should include a statement advising competitors at the time of passage of the zero car and include an Official's signed declaration that the stage is open.

- (5) Rally Panel requested that relevant parts of all rally Stewards Reports be sent to Rally Panel. It is impossible to act on any recommendations that Stewards make if they do not see them.
