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


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To be honest you know, it really doesn't seem like 3½ years ago that I first put pen to paper and wrote my first Editorial column.

NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting of the Brisbane Sporting Car Club Ltd., will be held in the B.S.C.C. Clubrooms, corner of Reid and Hawthorne Streets, Woolloongabba, on WEDNESDAY 27th MARCH 1991 at 8.00 p.m.

The business to be conducted at the Annual General Meeting shall be:

- (1) The consideration of the accounts, balance sheets and reports of members of the Board and auditors as are prescribed by the Act.
- (2) The election of members of the Board, auditor or auditors and life members (if any).
- (3) Consideration of motions of which notice has been given.
- (4) Any other general business.

In accordance with the Articles of Association, the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Club Captain and other members of the Board shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting and shall hold office for one year, when they shall retire, but are eligible for re-election.

Each candidate for the Board must be nominated in writing by two financial members of the Club and with the written consent of the nominee. Such nominations must be lodged with the Secretary at least fourteen (14) days before the Annual General Meeting (i.e. Wednesday 13th MARCH 1991 at the latest)

If insufficient nominations are received for the positions to be filled, nominations may be called from the floor on the night of the meeting. However, all such nominations take second place to the written ones received in the required time. Nomination forms are enclosed with this Magazine and are available from the Club Secretary - please use them. It is most important that we have an enthusiastic and active committee to act on behalf of the Club.

If you are unable to attend the meeting you may appoint a proxy to vote in your place. A person appointed a proxy must be a member of the Club. Proxy forms must be lodged with the Secretary at least twenty-four (24) hours before the time for holding the meeting. Proxy forms are also enclosed with this Magazine - please use one if you cannot attend in person.

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
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
















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THE DENTIST'S DELIGHT

A night run was recently run by Glen 'Honda-San' Weston to commence the year's championship and was held on 6 February 1991.


Being the bastard that he is Glen set a top-notch nightrun with just enough trickiness involved to produce what all night-run directors crave - one winning crew.

THE GP CARS RALLY DRIVER'S SCHOOL

That very situation was the start of the idea to host the first 1991 GP CARS Rally Drivers School.

Amongst the organisers were Richard Anderson and Rod Browning, and they recruited John Goasdoue, Stewart Reid and Ian Reddiex to assist in the driver training for the weekend.

The friendly folk and forests of Gallangowan were chosen as the place to host such an event and the oval and the school were put to good use in this learning experience. Initially it was anticipated that about 12 students could be catered for but due to the overwhelming interest, the initial class size was extended to 17 with vehicles ranging from a Honda Civic to an Audi Quattro.

Saturday rained hard and whilst this did not affect the hands-on-steering-wheels action it made it uncomfortable for those who had planned to camp out under the stars.

The school was made available for those who wanted it and the even smarter ones camped upstairs on the carpeted floor rather than under the building on the concrete.

On Sunday morning it was time to hit the rally roads and the men in charge had set up a number of routes which were also able to be covered in reverse.

Although one would expect the young up-and-coming to constitute the majority of the learners, there were a number of maturer competitors who were sure that this course would offer them something.

Unfortunately, as can be expected from any event held under competition conditions there are some cars which develop problems and the Rally School weekend was no different.

Poor Brian Crisp seized the turbo-charger in his Subaru RX-Turbo which brought an early halt to his driving efforts, Glen 'The Apprentice Dentist' Weston had a strut let go and general consensus was that the Civic's 31" diameter discs were not quite good enough.

The amazing Audi Quattro suffered some irritating injector trouble which Dick Boardman should have fixed by QRC-1 and Chris Nixon who borrowed the Z-Car Workshop 280Z for the weekend, had a mickey-split of a spin and brushed a bank.

All in all the driving performances were quite creditable and every competitor deserves praise for the mature manner in which they conducted themselves.

Thanks go to Rod and Richard for the preliminary organisation and to John, Ian and Stewie for their invaluable training assistance. Finally three cheers for GP CARS who have notched up another mark in their history of supporting our sport.

There will be further schools scheduled during the year and so anyone who is seriously interested should contact one of our organisers as soon as possible and let them know you're keen.

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
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NEW RALLY WEAPONS FOR 1991

It's usually about this time of the year that we reveal details of new vehicles which can be expected to appear on the Championship scene in the forthcoming season.

As has previously been advised it is expected that Garry Marshall will unveil his newly constructed 280% which should be a real performer.

Rod Cross and Tony Kabel will both soon be unleashing their Suzuki Swift GTi 4wd cars. Powered by a S.O.H.C. 16-valve injected motor, the vehicles won't be outright contenders but will prove quite competitive in their own right.

Dean Tighe has converted girlfriend Lyndal's Suzuki Swift GTi into a Group N car and the pair have already debuted the car in the Moby Vic's Classic Rally where they finished a creditable fifth outright.

Dick Boardman, who sadly wrecked his Cordia Turbo rally car at Gallangowan will be up and running in the ex-Geoff Keys Audi Quattro and should certainly throw a cat amongst the pigeons.

Rod Dawson has constructed a new Gemini to replace the one he wrote-off at Gallangowan and whilst he was at it, he whipped one up for Murray Coote as well.

Speaking of Murray, it now appears to be general knowledge that the all-new Mazda 323 GTX will be ready in time for ARC-1. This car is unique in Australia and should prove one step quicker than the previous model which it replaces.

Bruce Dummett, from Nambour, who destroyed his Mazda 323 4wd at Gallangowan last year has a new shell and is well on the road to recovery. If the turbo-charged all wheel drive car is not ready, he will turn out for the preliminary rounds in his old Datsun 1600, now sporting an 1800 PRC motor which is apparently a flyer.

Also from the North Coast, young David Bates had been impressing many people with his form last year before tipping his car in a big way at the Gallangowan QRC. He apparently is considering an update to another type of Nissan, albeit turbo-charged and rear-wheel driven. In the meantime he is rebuilding the 1600 into another shell at the Lee family workshop in Nambour.

That's about all that I can report on at the moment but if any readers are aware of any new interesting vehicles be sure to pass on the information please.
