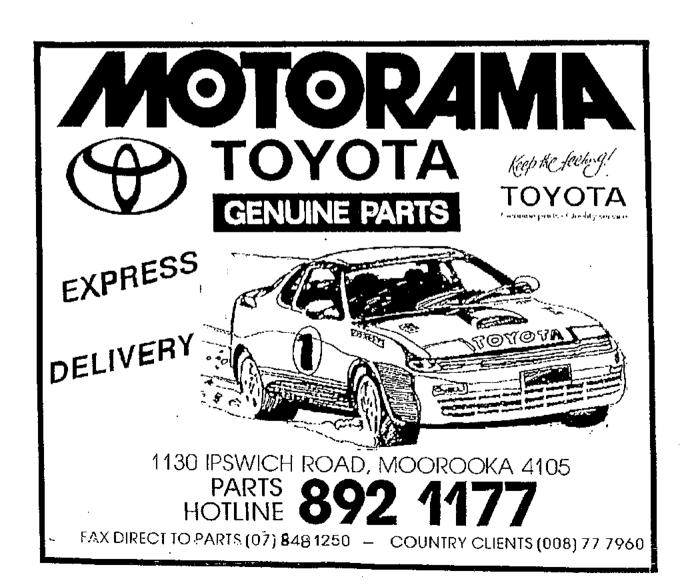

# TWENTY RUNS IN THE OLD. ROUND OF THE A.R.C.

# IS THIS A RECORD?

The Australian Rally Championship was first run in 1968. A round of the Championship has been held in Queensland every year since then except in 1988 when a certain police Superintendent refused to allow a permit to be issued for the event.

This means that a round of the Australian Rallyt Championship has now been held 25 times in Queensland. On every occasion the event has been organised by the Brisbane Sporting Car Club.

For these twenty-five times there have only been six different Directors - Henk Kabel, Garry Connelly, Peter Marshall, Jim Reddiex, Dennis Brown and Errol Bailey.

I have competed in twentyone out of these twenty-five
events and was wondering if
this was a record. I have a
number of entry lists from
early events, but not for
every single year, and would
like to hear from anybody
who thinks that they can
equal or beat twenty starts
in the event.

Anybody who has missed out more that five times since 1968 (not including 1988 when everybody missed out) or who did not start competing until 1974 or later need not apply.

Murray Coote has rarely missed the event, competing either as a driver or navigator and would possibly have competed more than twenty times, particularly if competing as thrid crew member when his brother was navigating can be counted.

From memory, other competitors who started competing earlier than I did, and are still competing now or have only recently retired would include Laurie Garth, Rod Browning, Errol Bognuda, John Hall, Dennis Brown, and George Kahler.

One competitor who started shortly after I did and has rarely missed the event is Rod Cross.

Of the names on this list I would guess that Rod Browning has competed moretimes than anybody else. Rod also started as a navigator and changed to driving. As I said before, this information is partly from memory and I apologise if I have forgotten anybody.

in 1971 first competed which means that I have only missed competing in event twice (apart from the aforementioned 1988). This was in 1976 when I to planning compete but broke my leg about a month before the event was held, and in 1980 when the driver I was to navigate for was unable to get his car ready in time. I don't know if it is a coincidence but 1976 and 1980 events were two of the wettest with not competitors finishing either time.

As mentioned earlier I first

competed in 1971, navigating for Tony Perrett in a Minivan.

We had a lot of fun and finished the event. I do not remember what place we finished in but it was not last. We did not event have a Halda and I converted route chart distances from hundredths to the nearest tenths and added them to the speedo reading showing at the start of the section.

Being well back in the field we had plenty of wheel tracks to follow. I also navigated for Tony in 1977 in Lisle Neumann's Honda Civic. (Lisle had entered the event but decided not to drive as he was fairly certain it would not finish. He was right, but I think we got a bit over halfway!)

Tony Perrett competed regularly in rallies until 1984, and I navigated for him many times including one Alpine, but never again in a Queensland ARC round.

I navigated for Lisle Neumann more times than anybody else. I was his regular navigator from 1973 to 1979 and then again in 1984-1985 but he did not compete in the ARC round every year.

Of the five times I navigated for him we had very ggod results in 1973 and 1974 in the first Datsun 1600 and in 1975 in the silver Honda. He then took Ian Young in the yellow Honda when I had the broken leg. This was the car that Tony Perrett and I ran in 1977. For 1978 Lisle built up another Datsun 1600 but he did not run in the ARC round that year. I navigated

for him in 1979 when we did not finish.

He continued to run this car until 1983 with Peter Young navigating. By then it was worn out and he and Peter Graham built up a couple of new Datsun 1600's for 1984. I navigated for Peter Graham in 1984 and for Lisle in 1985. Both years we retired.

In a later event in 1985 we hit a tree in Lisle's 1600 and wrote it off. Lisle then bought Peter's car but has run it rarely since then, mainly because it is still a Group G.

There were two drivers who I have navigated for three times each, Alan Cutts and George Kahler. I navigated for Alan in 1981 in his Datsun Stnza and in 1982 and 1983 in his Mitsubishi Lancer. We finished three times, reasonably well of the maior out placings, except that in 1983 we were disqualified for having a non-standard strut brace.

This was in when most cars were Group G and we chose to run in the then new PRC class, which insisted oncars being much closer to PRC rules have standard. been relaxed since then, and when I look at the strut braces on the present Group N cars I sometimes think we may have been treated unfairly, but those were the rules in 1983.

I navigated for George Kahler in 1986 and 1987 in the Mazda RX7. In 1986 we did not finish but we had a very good result in 1987. We had entered in the Mazda 323 in 1988 but this was the year of the no-issue of the

police permit.

We entered again in the 323 in 1989 and this was my best result in the event so far, third outright behing Greg Carr/Mick Harker and Murray Coote/Iain Stewart.

In 1990 and 1991 I navigated for Chris Devere in his little Datsun 1200. In 1990 we had a trouble-free run and finished in twentysecond place but in 1991 we tried to go a bit quicker and did not finish, although at one stage we were lokking for a class win. In 1992 I for navigated Cahrambolous in his Toyota Celica and we had another trouble-free run for place (out of 70 starters) and thid year I navigated for David West in his Suzuki we came eleventh outright and won our class a very good result for a 1300cc Group N.

Thos eof you following this story closely may have noticed two years not mentioned yet. These were the years when I navigated for drivers noted more for their flamboyant styles desperate driving than for their finishing records or results.

In 1972 I navigated for Bryan Evans in a Mazda RX3 and we finished in last place due to spending a lot of time getting the car back on the road after we ran off a floodway, and in 1978 I navigated for Roger Kimeklis in a Torana XU-1 and retired when the harmonic balancer let go, probably due to the engine being made to exceed it's normal rev range by a considerable margin.

Anyway, back to where I

started this story.

If I or whoever beats me has created a record in Queensland, the next step is to see if it is Australiawide. I do not think that there would be very many competitors who have run in the ARC round in their home state more than twenty Ιt times. would be interesting to see who holds the Australian record.

It would be easy to exceed this figure if interstate rounds are included, but this would be a completely different set of circumstances. It could also be argued that with the coeficient system now in operation there is no longer a single home-state ARC round.

In this case the record would be for the number of times a person has competed ina pre-coefficient round held between 1968 and 1992 (nineteen times in my case).

As the rules have now changed the holder of this record can be assured that it will naver be broken.

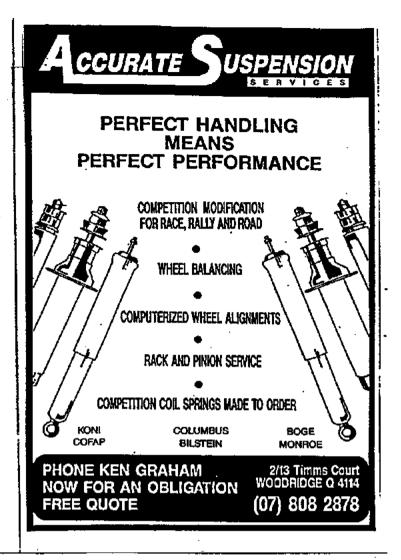

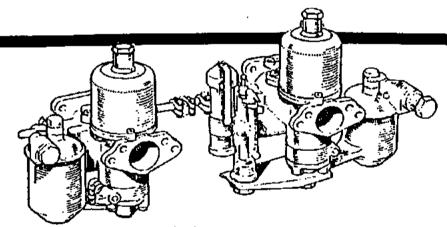

# YOKOERNA RALLY OUEENSLAND

The organisers of this year's C10 round of the ARC faced an uphill battle from early on in their campaign because of the lack of a major financial sponsor.

Despite efforts by many of the crew, no corporation was willing to meet the reqest for funds to support what was in 1992 the most highly rated ARC C10 event in the calender.

Then along came YOKOHAMA and their Queensland Manager and his chequebook. After much discussion with Clerk-of-the-Course Errol Bailey, an agreement was reached which would see the company provide enough money to claim naming rights for the rally. Not a huge amount of cash, mind you, as was evidenced by the reasonably small amount of prizemoney on offer.

The 'never-say-die' organisers did not give up however, and they delivered a rally of the highest calibre.

A slightly disappointing field of only 48 starters turned out to the Toombul Shopping Centre carpark on Saturday morning 26 June. This was a little down on the field for the '92 event which was cut short at 70, with 5 reserves.

Nonetheless, an impressive field it was with two factory Subaru's including the 'Possum' Bourne 'Prodrive' example, Neal Bates (no relation to Alan) and his Celica GT4. Backing up the rest were a Group N Lancer RS for Ed Ordynski, a

couple of Pulsars and a cluster of good State level cars including Mazda 323's, VR4's, the ex-Coote Mazda 323GTX, Laser TX3 4wd, and the usual field of very spectacular 2 wheel drive cars.

The 'bad luck' award went to John and Meryl Rogers in their little Corolla, who had just updated to 1600 power and blew the donk on the Wednesday night before the event. Unfortunately, they didn't make the start.

C-o-t-C Bailey had told listeners on Radio 4QR during the week that the cars were going to be doing 160 kph in the carpark next to Schultz's Canal at the start.

He was almost offering a bottle of Scotch to the crew that would get to that speed, and believe me, everone was trying pretty hard.

I believe the top speed achieved was about 130kph from the 'Possum-mobile', and that was really 'hooting'.

The field was then sent on their merry way up through Woodford to come into Beerburrum forest from the west, covering two more stages on the way through.

some great roads, the On. speeds being attained were awesome, but the boys at the front of the field were still quicker. 'Possum''s 299 hp, 6 speed Subaru must have been totally off the planet, with the closest competitor Bates' Celica. A regroup then followed at fancy 'Ettamogah Pub' tourist spot. I just love the name of that servo -"The Piston Broke".

Whilst the crews sat around telling each other how fast they had been, the tourists watched in fascination.A quick drink later we were to hit the forestdoing the longest proper, the event of section "Borumba Long", at 35 k's.

A trip up the highway to followed and the Gympie field did a blast around Roadcraft before another regroup. Then it was out to the forests west of Gympie do some great stages before the nighttime ran out and we all  $\bar{h}$ eaded back to the Parc Ferme at Roadcraft in Gympie.

Included in the afternoon stages was the infamous Cutter's Camp spectator point which we always seem to approach from a different angle. This year it was from the 'top' road and we bore left and came down to the hard right-hander.

It was pleasing to see so many spectators out in the forests and I believe that the organisers made it

possible for the speccies to see all cars through before heading off to the next point in time for car 1. What a good idea, there's nothing worse than having to pick 20 speccy points out of 130 and then missing the fast guys because you're doing 160kph just to get there!

After Saturday's overnight halt the field left Parc Ferme and went out again to do some fresh stages and some we'd done the day before.

It's amazing the difference the lack of dust makes. On roads where the driver has to baulk at 35kph, the same car does 140 kph in clear vision. Yes, the dust on Saturday night was <u>bad</u>!

After finishing in the Imbil area we trucked on down the highway to Berrburrum to do the final stage at 'Cave's Road', just behind the Rest Stop on the old highway. What a great stage it is too and Possum Bourne managed to make fastest time, even with his engine as dead as a doornail.

Once again it was great to see so many spectators out in the boonies, although the beauty of the Beerburrum location is that it is only 45 minutes from Brissy. The finish at Southbank was a spectacular occasion with many people wandering around and over the cars, all of which were cleaned at Mobil Aspley.

The event was great and well received by all crews. At the presentation on Sunday night there was nothing but praise for all concerned.

# AUSTRALIAN OFF ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP

### INTRODUCTION

Perhaps the first thing I should mention is that the progressive point scores, as shown in AGRC Reveletter 02/93, contain a couple of errors. They credit two Class I competitors with points, even though they were not classified as finishers. This will be rectified in the next point score summary.

As many of you would be aware, the Mational Off Road Committee met in Melbourne on the weekend of 19th-20th June. Some of the major matters discussed are summarised briefly below.

### CLASS 5

Bob Stansfield and Mark Hanns attended the meeting (at their own expense) and put a comprehensive submission on the Class 5 chassis regulations to the Committee. While it was accepted that the regulations as published in the March 1993 edition of CAMSReport did not have the effect of making ineligible any vehicle which had complied with the regulations they replaced, the Committee acknowledged that it was appropriate to reconsider 

A number of amendments were proposed, and if accepted, SR 5.3 would read as follows.

Id read as follows.

The original chassis or sub-frames must be retained in their original location.

The chassis or sub-frame rails must remain unchanged in dimension, separation, plan view and silhouette.

Haterial may be added to the chassis for any purpose. Engine, transmission mounts and cross members may be removed, relocated or refurbished.

Any surplus brackets and mounts may be removed. On sub-frame or body-shell vehicles, as defined, it is permissible to remove only the minimum amount of material necessary to allow the fitment of approved wheels, tyres and suspension components.

Before it puts this to the National Council for ratification and inclusion in the 1994 Hanual of Notor Sport, the Committee wants as much feedback as possible. Bob Stansfield has agreed to coordinate this feedback, and also to handle any enquiries from competitors with regard to the technical implications of the amendment. Because, like wost of us, Bob is still in the unhappy position of having to work for a living in order to support his addiction to off roading, after hours telephone calls would be such better received than calls during working hours. Your co-operation in this regard would be very much appreciated by him.

It would also be helpful if, instead of each Class 5 competitor responding individually, feedback could be coordinated through off road clubs and state off road panels on their way to Bob. This will mean he only has to look through a dozen or so coordinated responses, as opposed to possibly several hundred individual responses.

### AORC POINTSCORES

The topic of pointscores for the Australian Off Road Chaspionship has been the subject of some contention over the past couple of years. It seems to be of concern to a number of people that the way the present system is structured it is possible for the everall chaspion to not be the chaspion of his particular class. This possibility arises because the class chaspionships and outright chaspionship are based on separate criteria.

At the MCRC meeting Keith Owers put a comprehensive submission to the Committee and proposed a new system. This can perhaps best be described as a variation of the pointscore system that was in place prior to 1991.

It does, however, have a significant difference in that "class points" would be reduced in the event of low numbers of entries in that particular class.

The Committee foreshadowed its intention to recommend that this system be adopted for 1994, but has requested competitor input before proceeding further. A copy of the proposal is included with this newsletter, and any input you might care to provide should be given to me, either at Kempsey or at CAMS.

Again at the NORC meeting Keith Overs (he has been a <u>very</u> busy lad lately!) tabled a submission on ACRC prize money.

The major shortcoming perceived with the current system is that, as far as prize monies are concerned, the better supported classes are subsidizing those which are less well supported. For example, at Kempsey last year Class I competitors, which made up 24.2½ of the field, collected 12% of the class prize monies. Against this, Class 4 competitors, who comprised only 4.4% of the field, collected 9.6% of the class prize monies.

The system proposed by Reith would see the class prize monies for the different classes reflect the number of entries in these classes. Fut simplistically, if Classes 9 provides 50% of the field, then 50% of the class prize monies will be allocated to Class 9.

The Off Road Committee will be recommending to the National Council that the system proposed by Keith be accepted for 1994;

### ROLLOVER PROTECTION

It is intended that a number of vehicles will be weighed at Kempsey. Don't panic - this is not the latest fiendish plot by the powers that be to make your life more difficult.

Those of you who are familiar with the regulations for rollover protection will be sware that the minimum tubes section (steel) for the main hoop in off road vehicles is 45mm × .2.5mm. However, if the vehicle weighs less than 700kgs the minimum tube section required is 18mm × 2.5mm. The Committee is currently reviewing this requirement, and as part of this review needs to obtain some data relating to current vehicle weights.

Quite possibly one or two vehicles will be found not to comply with these regulations but it is <u>not</u> intended to take any action in respect of these vehicles at this stage! However, this should not be taken as implying open slather for competitors with vehicles weighing two and half ton or so to use the smaller tube section!

Before any action is taken, warning well in advance will be given so that people know what is happening and have reasonable time in which to effect any changes. At the same time, it is quite likely that the 700kg "cut off point" might be adjusted upwards; but this will depend on a number of technical factors.

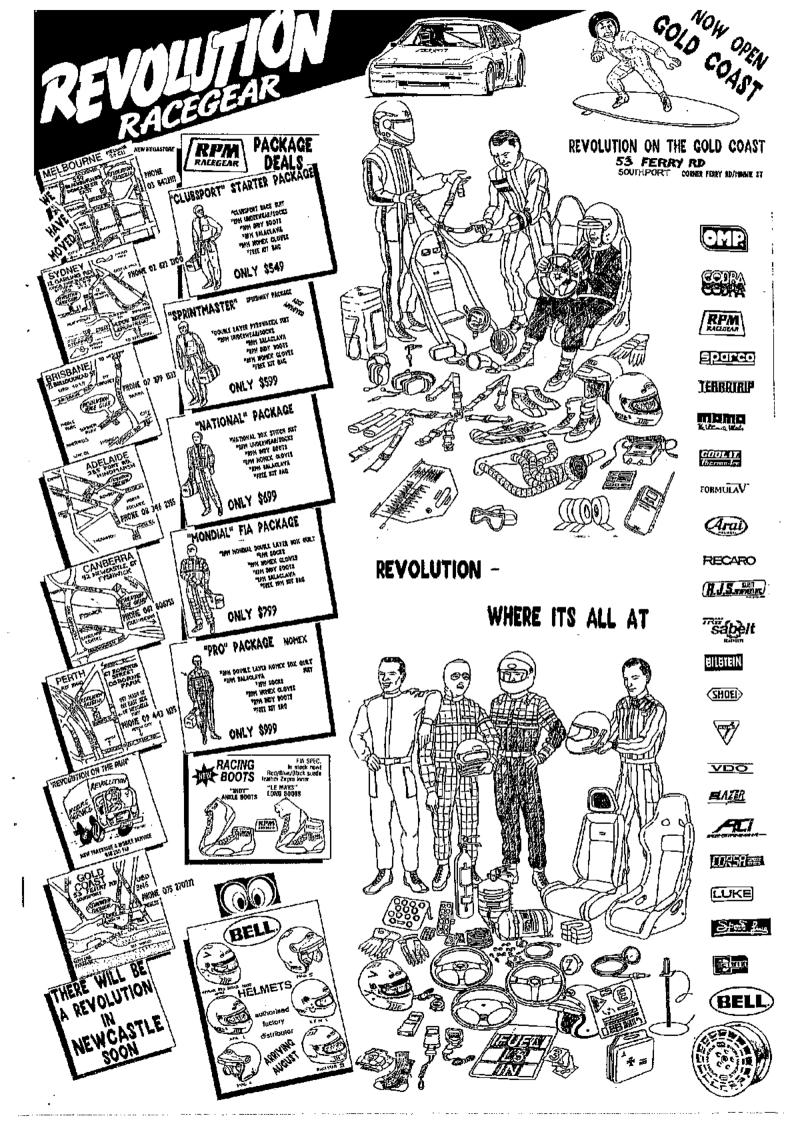

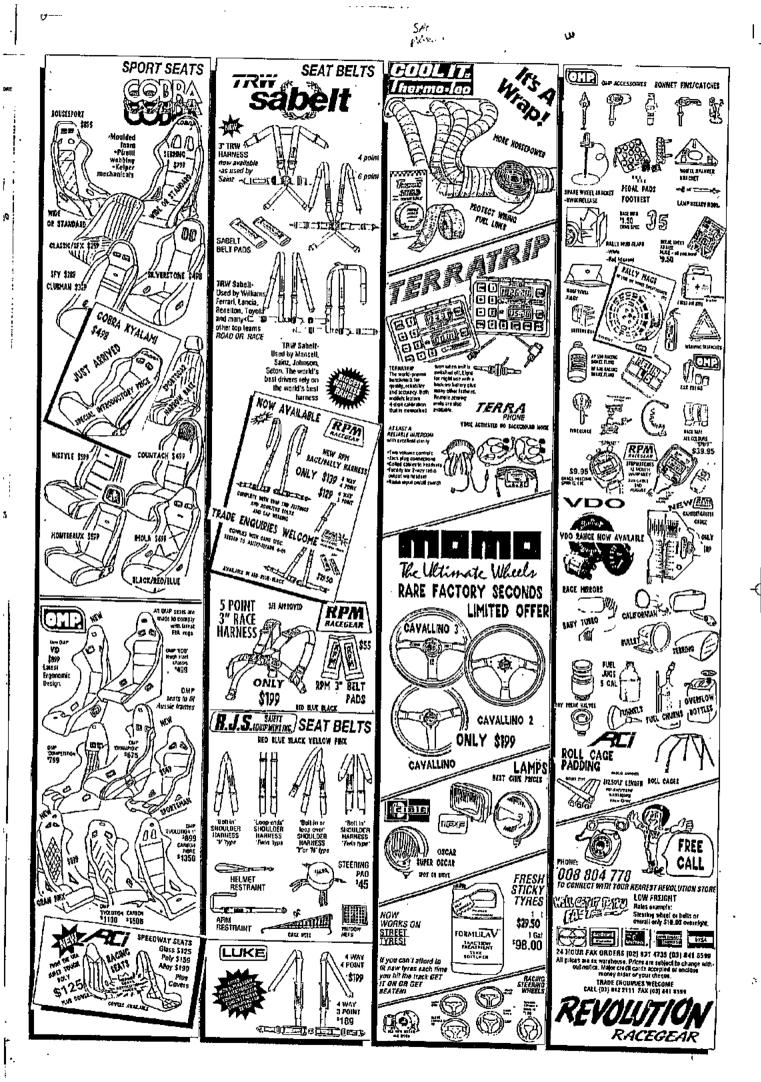
