





Maybe we should go back to 'theme' nights when a menu of certain origins would accompany the run. I remember a certain Mexican night.....





RRRR Rallysprint - Round 1

The first rallysprint in Queensland this year was held on the 1st May.

It was organised by the BSCC and was the first round of the Revolution Racegear - Road and Race Spare Parts Rallysprint Series.

The event was directed by Ian Gorski and the Benarkin State Forest was used. Two special stages were set, each being five kilometres long and used twice, making a total of four stages.

All crews were given two reconnaisance or practice runs on each stage.

A total of thirty entries were received, but two of these did not start. An interesting entry was Bruce Hodgson who ran his London-to-Sydney Falcon GT.

Modified cars (group G) were allowed to compete, and seven of these cars ran - three Escorts, three Datsuns and a Torana.

First casualty was Bruce Dummett's Datsun 1600 which had engine problems on the reconnaisance run. first During the special stages there other were six retirements, five due and accidnets Hodgson Falcon with ignition problems.

Another competitor spent half an hour digging his car out of a ditch, but still eventually finished.

All of the competitors rated the course as very good. The first special stage had some fast straights and the second one was more twisty. There had been some light rain on the days preceding the event and the roads were a bit slippery for the reconnaisance but the two non-competitive runs packed the roads down nicely.

Fortunately there was no rain on the day of the event and no dust either.

Very good performances that from a number drivers comparatively new to rallying included Lee Killer (Celica) in 6th, Kevin in .7th Taylor (Escort) place, Randall Bryson 1600) 8th, (datsun darren KE25) Walk (Toyota Michael Scheers (Gemini) 10th.

This Shows that the Rallysprint Series is a very good training ground for the novices.

At the conclusion of the event the trophies were presented by Reg Tomkinson of Revolution Racegear. His sponsorship of the Series was greatly appreciated.

The Rallysprint Series in Queensland consists of four rounds, with the second round being held on Sunday 5th June.

The format will be exactly the same with 20 kilometres of special stages using two 5 km stages run twice.

The Director will be Bruce Dawson, and the venue will be the Beerburrum Forest, just on the northern outskirts of Brisbane.





As we are such slow learners we will most probably be snared into assisting next time. Helpers are always needed and it is a great excuse for a few hours of total relaxation in the bush.



Classic Mapping Touring Assembly

The second Historic rally held in Queensland this year was the "Classic Mapping Touring Assembly" held on the 24th April.

This event was organised by the BSCC with Ken Philp as Director. It commenced at 8.30 am from Sheli Calamvale (on Beaudesert Road south of Brisbane) and finished by mid-afternoon.

Thirteen cars started the event, all being built prior to 1975. Sports cars included two "big" Healeys, two sprites, one Midget, one Z car and one Lotus Elan Plus Two, while among the sedans were a Valiant, a Saeb, a Corona, a Renault, a Hillman Hunter and a Datsun 1600.

The morning division took the crews to the lunch break at Beaudesert with four competitive sections. Sections 2 and 3 used map references, and the Director had incorrectly considered that the black line along the bottom of the map was a grid line, which confused a number of crews.

Only bitumen roads were used, and everyone particularly enjoyed the little-used twisty mountain range crossing between Kerry and Hillview. Section 4 used a stick-chart which went off the official map. A number of crews picked up a road that the Director had missed, but realised they were wrong when the bitumen ended, and most still managed to complete the section on time.

Despite these problems two crews made it to the lunch break with no points lost, and another crew on one point.

There were another three sections in the afternoon. The first section after lunch took crews to Boonah using an average speed section. These crews lost no points at the secret time check but others were up to two minutes wrong.

The remainder of the event used map references, and was slightly harder than the first division, with all crews losing some time. There are many roads in the Boonah-Kalbar-Peak Crossing area and the shortest mapped route was often very close to the next alternative.

Some sections specified "shortest mapped route" and some specified "shortest mapped bitumen route". Only bitumen roads were used on the rally but some roads shown as gravel on the map had been sealed since the map was printed.

The rally finished mid-afternoon at BP Blacksoil, just out of Ipswich. The winners were Ted Peel/Tony Best (Datsun 2402) with 8 points lost, from Craig Wilson/Tony Galletly (Lotus Elan) 21 points, Tony and Sara Slattery (MG Midget) 37 points, and Ian Ferguson and Alan Stean (Saab 99EMS) 69 points. All other competitors lost in excess of 100 points.

Senna

I, as current editor of this magazine and my predecessors have never offered an indepth coverage of Formula 1 in this magazine, but recent events have influenced me to include this piece.

As I write I have heard on the radio that another Fomula 1 driver lies in a coma as a result of a highspeed crash in practice for Monaco.

In the Imola race Ayrton Senna sustained massive head injuries from a 250kph+ crash into a concrete barrier, and died some time later.

Previously, Roland Ratzenberger one of the Simtek drivers (featuring Australian David Brabham) died as the result of a similar crash in pre-race qualifying.

Unfortunately Ratzenberger was a virtual 'novice' in F1 and this was only his second GP. For Senna this was his 161st, so it goes to show that the risks accompany the fresh or the experienced.

I enjoy Formula 1 and went to Adelaide in 1985 to watch the inaugural Australian GP but I wouldn't say that I was fanatical about it.

However, that said, I am the first to admit my admiration for Ayrton Senna. The man was a 'freak', and regardless of the comparisons bandied about was in my eyes the most talented Formula 1 driver the world has seen.

It has been said that none will match Juan Mauel Fangio, or that the 'Professor' (Alain Prost) was the best, but Senna was the only driver who could always pull out a special effort to win pole, or pull off an impossible passing manouver.

With three World Championships under his belt the man was only 34 years old and had many years of racing in front of him.

His funeral procession in Sao Paulo Brazil was apparently watched by one million people lining the streets, such was the magnetism of this man in his home country.

The motor-racing world has lost a legend, there is no doubt about that.

Whether up-and-coming drivers like Michael Schumacher display the same hunger that Senna always did remains to be seen, and whether anyone can possibly fill the shoes of the Brazilian is doubtful.

Had Ayrton Senna lived through his accident and raced on, the world was his oyster and there is little doubt that he would have continued on his winning way.

As it is, the whole world is only now coming to realise that Ayrton Senna will not be at the next GP.

It's almost as if JFK had been shot all over again.




