
The Dinner/Dance will be held on July 30 at the Ipswich Civic Hall Auditorium.

This will not stop the motorsporting aspirations of either as Steve will continue to race and Emma is the only silly enough to sit beside Colleen.



BORUMBA DAM SKI WEEKEND

I am sure I speak for all who ventured past the infamous rally roads around Imbil to take part in the club's first to my knowledge "Water Ski Weekend", when I thank the Michel's both Neil and Angela for their efforts. They organised everything right down to camping permits for everyone, much of this was done remotely from Tasmania while competing in the Targa.

Brett Wright, Ian Bremner and Neil Michel were already there with their respective partners Karen, Cherylee and Angela, Barrie "The Chef" Burr was also along for the fun. My son Justin and I arrived late Saturday with just enough time for one ski before setting up camp for the evening. But Oh what a ski, after a 6-7 year break, I lasted longer than I thought and while on the water thought I was still ok. When we arrived back at the bank, my legs had turned into jelly sticks that had decided to limit my control over them, causing a somewhat drunken walk.

Saturday night we were all treated to a Bar-B-Que "ah-la-burr" this man is wasted with Aus Post. 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RRRR RALLYSPRINT (5 JUNE 1994)

Two out of the scheduled four rounds of the Revolution Racegear Road and Race Spare Parts Rallysprint Series have now been run.

The second round was held on Sunday 5 June. The same format as the first round with two used sections kilometre each being run twice, ad with every crew being given two twice, ad with reconnaisance or practice over both sections before the timed runs were conducted.

It had originally been planned to run the event in the Cowhin Creek area of the Beerburrum Forest, but a considerable amount of rain a few days before the event made that area too wet to use, and the organisers changed the location to the Woodford area at the western end of the Beerburrum forest.

Queensland Forest Service employess Barry Stark and Neil Sims were very helpful and co-operative, and their assistance enabled the event to go ahead at it's new location at very short notice.

So far there has been hardly any rain since the 5th of June and hopefully the Coochin Creek venue will be dry enough to be used on either the 31 July or 28 August.

A total of 45 entries were received which was 15 more

than the first round.

First retirement was Bruce Dummett (Datsun 1600) who had engine problems in the first 10 kilometres, however this was twice as far as he managed to go in the first round so his reliability is improving.

There were two rollovers. Darren and Jason Walk provided good entertainment for the value spectators as they picked the first spectator point to roll their Corolla, while David Miller and Anderson showed that legendary rotary qualities of their R100 were still quite true.

It was good to see a Mini entered in the event but unfortunately Robert Dybo and Andrew Badkie had retire when they had two flat tyres in one section. Other retirements were John and Daniel Gibson in their Lancer and Michael Hocking/Mark Carbine (Torana), but this still total of left а finishers.

Fast open roads were used, and this gave an advantage to the larger cars. The winning crew was Michael Page/Ian Syme in an Escort from Barry Cook/Wes Depper (Datsun 280Z) and Bruce Hodgson/Robert Brotchie in the ex London-to-Sydney Falcon GT.

Fourth place went to Grant

Yarrow/John Slattery in a Celica. This was the one run by John Dobbie approximately five years ago and was dragged out of retirement and dusted off to compete again in motor sport. It was good to see it back in action.

Fifth place went to Rob Bekker and Tony Wilson in a Toyota Trueno and sixth went to John Goasdoue and Rob Reddiex in a Datsun 1600. John purchased this car from John Spencer having recently sold his Daihatsu Charade. Talking of Charades, Singleton had his first run in the ex-Bruce Fullerton car and finished 23rd outright and second in class.

As the results of the first round of the Rallysprint Series were Barry Cook first and Michael Page third, these two drivers are now very close in the Series so the third round oshould be well worth watching.

The Rallysprint Series is one of the few remaining areas of motorsport that allow modified (Group G) to compete and it was good to see fifteen cars of this type running compared with only seven in the first round.

There must be many of these cars under houses and in sheds and it would be great to see more of them competing.




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
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Historic Rallying

The June meeting of the Historic Rally Group welcomed several new members as well as two guest speakers. Ken Philp who organised the recent Classic Mapping Rally presented awards to outright and class winner's on the night. The rally also received some positive feedback.

Our first guest speaker was Jon Voller and his talk was well worth the long wait. Jon has been a local Morgan sports car enthusiast for over 20 years and competed in the 1993 Historic Marathon (Paris to Casablanca) last October with Sir David Steele from England. The event was a gruelling affair and after seeing the slides that Jon brought along, it's not for the faint hearted. The route covered many scenic areas in Europe and Africa, while the roads ranged from the narrow mountain roads in Spain to the rough dirt (goat tracks) sections in Africa. Entry was open to selected vehicles built before '68 with Jon competing in a much modified Ford Zephyr.
