







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I'm writing this column in early September as I'm going to be away for the better part of the month in Perth as a competitor in Telecom Rally Australia.

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#### RRRR RALLYSPRINT ROUND 4 \*\*SERIES FINAL\*\*

The fourth and final round of the Revolution Racegear - Road and Race Spare Parts Rallysprint Series was held on Sunday 28 August.

The event was organised by the Brisbane Sporting Car Club and was run in the Coochin Creek forestry area. In fact the course was that originally set for the June event, but abandoned because of rain at that time.

Coochin Creek is in a low lying sandy area close to the coastal mangrove swamps and not particularly well drained. The area is radiate plantation consisting of straights of 400 to 700 metres in length with most corners being close to right angles.

Road conditions varied according to the amount of use and maintenance by the Forestry Department - some being good and fast, some being a bit rough. (There were no hills).

Event headquarters was at the Coochin Creek Forest Park, a camping and picnic area with all amenities. The event consisted of two sections each of five kilometres, being run twice for reconnaisance and twice for the timed competitive sections. There had been a small amount of rain before the event - enough to ensure there was no dust but not enough to make the roads wet.

A total of 45 entries were received (down a bit on the 50 entries for the third round). This included 12 modified (Group G) cars.

The main interest centred on the battle for an outright series win between Michael Page (Escort) and Barry Cook (Datsun 280Z). Competition in many of the classes was also very close.

There were no major problems during the

running of the event. Unlike previous rounds of the series there were no rollovers. Possibly the road conditions were more predictable.

Hardly anybody even had any panel damage, although there were a number of spins observed at spectator points and heard at other locations.

There were however a number of retirements due to mechanical problems, and two competitors became bogged when they got into a muddy drain beside the road and were out of late time by the time they got going again.

They were not the only two. The same problem happened to one of the Zero cars. Fortunately there was another vehicle available so this did not cause any delays to the event.

A total of 38 cars were classified as finishers and the two bogged cars also finished but were out of late time. This was a relatively good finish rate for rallysprints.

The surprise winners were Jeff Killbride and Donna Heitmann in a Mazda 323 4wd, possibly not such a surprise as it was potentially the fastest car in the event.

This was the only rallysprint that they had entered this year, so they were not really competing seriously for series points.

In second place were Barry Cook and Wes Depper (Datsun 280Z) some 22 seconds behind the Killbride Mazda. A further 5 seconds back were Peter Mapstone and Craig Mole in a Commodore (Craig ususally competes as a driver in his Datsun Stanza). This is by far the best result for Peter in the series so far, and he showed that he can be an outright contender.

Series leaders Michael Page and Ian Syme finished in fourth place, seven seconds behind Mapstone, but they were probally more interested in making sure that they finished the event and won the series.

The next three outright placings went to Garry Marshall/Sharon Bell (Datsun 280Z) Viv Gees/Shaun Ryan (Falcon XA GT) and Bruce Hodgson/Robert Brotchie (Falcon GT), so the event certainly appeared to favour the faster vehicles.

Up'to 1300 cc class winners were Andrew and Maureen Johnstone (Suzuki GTi), but they were only 21st outright. The roads and particularly the loose corners did not really suit the front wheel drive vehicles.

The 1300 to 1600cc class went to David Bates and Todd Warner in a Datsun 1600 (Yes some of them still have 1600cc engines).

This class consisted mainly of Geminis who had a real battle. Robert Crase/Fred van der Brink had the quickest Gemini, coming home third in class and 22nd outright.

The remaining Geminis finished 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th in the class and 25th, 26th, 29th, 30th and 31st outright, the margin between the quickest and slowest being 23 seconds.

The 1600 to 2000 cc class went to lan Bremner/Berenice Linton in an Escort. This crew has competed and finished all rounds of the series and hes been very consistent while the over 2000 cc class went to the Barry Cook/Wes Depper 280Z.

There was only one starter in the 4wd class- outright winner Jeff Killbride, while fourth placegetter and series winner Mike Page took out the modified car class.

Provisional outright results for the series are Page (78 points) from Barry Cook (65 points), it would have been much closer if Barry Cook had finished the third round. Then a fair gap to lan Bremner (36 points), Bruce Hodgson (33 points) and Spencer Yarrow in a Commodore (28 points).

Unfortunately Spencer did not finish the last round which probably cost him a couple of outright places

Andrew Johnstone was a clear series winner in the small car class. Rob Bekker in a Toyota Trueno won the 1600 class just ahead of David Bates, while Ian Bremner just beat Michael Guest (Datsun 1600- yes we have one of them living and rallying in Queensland as well as the one who lives in Newcastie.)

Barry Cook won the over 2 litre class ahead of the Commodores of Yarrow and Mapstone.

Equal winners of the 4wd class were Brian Crisp and Jeff Killbride, both in Mazda 323 varieties.

Both of them had only entered one event and were the only competitors in their class.

The owners of 4wd cars do not appear to be interested in rallysprints, which is a pity. This may all change when they are not allowed to run in the ARC but at the moment the owners of Z cars, Commodores, Escorts etc are happy.

The modified class in the series was won by outright winner Mike Page from Bruce Hodgson in his London-to-Sydney Falcon GT. Unfortunately this car does not comply with the present PRC rules so the only events that Bruce can run are rallysprints and marathons.

The 1994 rallysprint series was a success with good fields and most competitors enjoying it. The sponsorship given by Reg and Jan Tomkinson of Revolution Racegear Road and Race Spare Parts was greatly appreciated by all.

Trophies for the fourth round were presented to competitors at the conclusion of the event, bu the presentation for series awards (class and outright placings) is to be held at the BSCC clubrooms on Wednesday 12 October.

TEST FOUR caught everyone by surprise when they realized that the test required them to remove and replace any two wheels of the car. This was the first experience of tyre changing for some navigators but they handled it efficiently and still retained their sense of humour.

TEST FIVE had the driver blindfolded and the navigator responsible for guiding him through the course. Fortunately there were no mishaps and no spectators were in danger of being run over.

TEST SIX was again a straight motorkana event which allowed the drivers to show their driving skills.
