


THE BRISBANE SPORTING CAR CLUB







1997 MOTOR SHOW CLASSIC

A Monte Carlo start from four different shopping centres around Brisbane saw the twenty seven entrants in the Motor Show Classic converge on Musgrave Park, South Brisbane. The field comprised the regular historic stalwarts, motor show participant vehicles and some "new" historic competitors.

From South Brisbane the cars scattered to points north and south as Clerk of Course Pat Hetherman and Jim Reddiex schemed to confuse as many crews as possible. half the field toured through Newstead, Camp Hill, Mt Gravatt, Mot Cotton. Beenleigh, Browns Plains and Fairfield before returning to the Motor Show for the division The other half visited Newstead. Newmarket, Stafford, Strathpine, Pine Dam. Samford, Mt Nebo, The Gap, Bardon, Milton and returned to South Brisbane. The cars then swapped directions and headed along the other route. Several crews who had not read the supregs anticipated several hours inspecting the exhibits at the motor show after finishing their run in the morning. Weren't they surprised when Jim R advised them, (with a grin on his face), "they had to go around again.".

The entire event was based on the latest UBD street directory, with instructions being given as co-ordinate or street via's. Route checks/questions, were to be answered along the way. The location of these confused most crews as they could be located on the left, right, before, at or after the via's. The C of C's desire to make the route checks difficult was realised when 5 questions were answered correctly by fewer than four crews.

When scores were tallied. the Cortina. (resplendent in Lotus cream and green) of Tony Slattery and Tony Best triumphed with a loss of 8 1/2 questions and 2 minutes late time (172 points). Second was the well presented MG TF of Robin Edwards and Diana Kateley (234 points). Third place was a blanket finish with 5 cars finishing within 9 points. Dick Owen and Claire Swallows in the diminutive 850 Mini came out in front of the Wayne Johnstone/Michelle Gatton Datsun 1600, Geoffrey Broad/David Abbott Lotus, McKeons in a surprising reliable BMW and Tony Perrit in his Cooper S.

Thanks to the organisers, control officials and the Motor Show Committee for a taxing but enjoyable event.

We need 5 members from your club who would like to have their car photographed by one of Australias leading photographers


































NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

WE TALK TO THE CHAMPIONS - LAURIE

Following the finalisation of the point scores for 1996, Pat Hetherman spoke to BSCC Off-Road Champion, Laurie Svenson about his view of the sport and the way ahead.

Laurie has been directly involved in off-road racing since 1980, having been directly involved in four-wheel drive clubs and the Qld off-road association.


He began helping out by providing recovery back up for off-road events. Next, he found himself in a service crew and before you know it, he was behind the wheel.

Laurie's first off-road machine was a Swing Axle Kelpie Buggy. The machine had a diminutive wheel-base of just 84 inches. It was powered by a 1200cc Corolla motor.

By using technology borrowed from some local circuit racers, Laurie began the task of extracting real horsepower. He ran the machine with a compression ratio of 11.5:1 and scored some good local results in class three, winning a couple of events outright.

Laurie says his most satisfying season came in 1983, when he stormed to the lead in the demanding Kempsey Off-Road classic. He was leading the field by 20 minutes from off-road veteran, Craig Martin, when the stub axle broke and, as they say, the wheel fell off.

It's a tribute to his battling spirit that Laurie was able to press on, finishing third outright.

At the other end of the spectrum of motorsport experience, Laurie's toughest results were again at Kempsey, where twice, he went out on the last lap.

Looking ahead, Laurie wants to see the establishment of a stable off-road series and point-scoring system so that all competitors can plan ahead with certainty.

Today, Laurie owns and races two buggies, having purchased a single-seater class nine machine in 1985.

He is concerned at the pressures that are undermining short-course events.

According to Laurie, there is nothing to compare to wheel to wheel competition as found on the short courses. When the crowd can watch your every move, there is no room for excuses.

Laurie says these days many competitors prefer long course events, because they represent better value for money.

All at Brisport wish Laurie good luck for round one of the 1997 series, which will be held at **Reference** on March 2.






