NQ RALLY - ALL GO FOR QRC #3

Up to 50 entries are expected for the North Queensland round of the Queensland Rally Championship, to be staged by the Twin Cities Auto Club at Townsville on July 12 and 13.

Clerk of Course, Edwin Hetherington says he is looking forward to a big influx from the south-east of the State to challenge local hot shoes, Phil Mason (280Z) and Peter Vigor (VR4).

Mason and co-driver Katrina Egan and Vigor, with left-seater, Mim Crase, are local favourites for the event, which covers about 190kms (competitive) around Townsville, Ingham and Cardwell.

The Ingham sections, covering a total of about 30km each day, are new additions to the course. Edwin says that while these new stages are a little tighter, the event will certainly live up to its reputation for high speed.

Competitive sections are conducted through pine plantations, but on made

roads with few diversions.

Other northerners lining up for the start include Grant Ross (aka 'box-head') with navigator Robert Burke in a Toyota Supra and the ever-present Mackay couple – Keith Callinan and Paul Tenant in their Round Australia Commodore.

This is only the second year for the event, which enjoys sponsorship from Channel 10; Mercure Inn; Townsville

City Council; Snap On Tools; Brake Mart; Fulcrum Suspension; Dwyer Ford Ingham and John Barr Bridgestone Tyres.

Known as the "NQ Forest Rally", this event was conceived in an effort to make the QRC a truly State-wide championship and to promote rallying in the north. Clearly, the NQ club has succeeded on both counts.

Scrutineering for the two-day event will take place at the North Queensland Auto Sports Centre in Garbutt on the Friday night. Competition will get under way on Saturday with a two kilometre spectator stage near the Townsville Civic Theatre in the centre of the city.

Competitors will then transport north for 90km to lingham. After 30ks competitive, they'll travel a further 60km to Cardwell for an additional 60ks of racing based at the Cardwell showgrounds, where the cars will be placed in parc ferme overnight.

There is plenty of camping accommodation on site (\$3 a night) and the Country Club Hotel and Lyndoch Motel are nearby. There will be an evening barbeque, hot showers and breakfast at the Country Club Hotel.

On Sunday, the cars will race the forest and return to Townsville using many of the roads traveled the day before.




The event will end with a repeat of the display stage near the Civic Theatre.

Our cocky crews do well at Coffs

Brisbane competitors, John Spencer/
Hugh Reardon Smith, Jeff and
Donna Killbride, Adrian Bukmanis/
Ryan Parker, Tom Smith, Stuart Reid
and George Shepheard/Dominic
Corkeron were among 50 entries that
fronted the starter at Coffs Harbour
for the New South Wales round of
the ARC on June 7&8.

After the strong showing by local competitors at Falken Tyres Rally Queensland in May, Spencer and Killbride led a cocky Queensland contingent, although sadly Mapstone and I weren't in the necessary financial position to join the fray south of the border.

As it was, the Killbrides did us all proud, winning class P1 in the Suzuki while John Spencer and Hugh Reardon-Smith came very close to winning P4 in the Commodore V8, finishing 13th outright on Saturday in heat 1 and 20th in heat 2. Their result, and two crashes by the long reigning P4champ, SA competitor, Steve Winwood, means that John and Hugh will be travelling to Tasmania in a strong position in the P4 championship.

Once again, Stuart Reid had car troubles – breaking the input shaft of his Lancer Evo3 on SS4. His latest run of outs was probably minor, compared to Shepheard and Corkeron who hit a tree very hard on day one.

A broken driveshaft on Saturday and subsequent doubts about the gearbox plagued our local Rallysport news contributor, Tom Smith, who fronted at Coffs to co-drive for the Big Mac

team and Graham Vaughan.

Bukmanis/Parker had a better run, finishing both days.

Someone with less luck was the redoubtable Tony Best. First he was transferred to Barcaldine, then his regular ARC ride with David West was not available at Coffs. (I hope he found out before he got on the bus). John Goasdoue was another Queenslander who had a DNS at Coffs.

In other Coffs news, kiwi Greg Graham did well to defeat Michael Guest in Group N, while Ed Ordynski used a Group A Ralliart Car to come within a few seconds of the flying Possum Bourne/Craig Vincent on Saturday. Bates and Taylor in the Celica finished third on Saturday and second on Sunday.

The well deserving winner in P4 at Coffs was local legend, Peter Roberts with wife Pat, whose Commodore defeated Spencer and Reardon-Smith by 11 seconds on Saturday and 22 seconds on Sunday, with ARC 260Z regular, Rob Devenish, third.

Our spies at Coffs reported excellent weather with some dust. Stage one was relocated to the Coffs Harbour Showground. This was a big success and may be used as a recipe for changes to our own ARC round at Caloundra next year. Tyres were a problem for some with the rough roads causing considerable wear.


The next ARC round is in Tasmania on 12-13 July, followed by Melbourne at the end of August.





WHERE DOES YOUR MOTOR SPORT DOLLAR GO?




CAMS has as its brief the provision of a sporting infrastructure to enable members to participate in motor sport. Additional services provided include:





Off Road News

Some readers will be aware that Keith Morris, the CAMS Board member with responsibility for Off Roading, resigned earlier this year, Brian Dunstan, for his sins, takes over Keith's Board duties as well as his Off Roading responsibilities.

While a little new to Off Roading, Brian has had a long and distinguished involvement in motor sport and with CAMS, going back to 1956 when he began in rallies, hillclimbs and races. Brian's service includes a stint as President of CAMS (1972-75), and since then he has been active on CAMS' National Council (now Board) and on the Motor Racing Executive Committee, of which he has been chairman for the last 12 or so years.

Briefly, Brian sees his main Off Roading responsibility as being our avenue to the CAMS Board, helping the sport go in the direction its participants wish. He does not have his own vision for Off Roading, believing the direction of the sport should be determined by its members. He does his best to remain aware of the pressures confronting club-level competitors as well as those with a higher profile, and believes that the needs of all should be considered.

We welcome Brian on board, and trust that he not only survives the experience, but actually enjoys it!

To Keith, we extend our thanks and appreciation for his efforts over the past 15 months.

Class 7 Subclass

Those involved with or interested in Class 7 would be aware that in recent months a small team has spent a lot of time working on the concept of creating a standard subclass within Class 7. For want of a better title, it has been called Series Production Four-Wheel Drive.

The team has drawn up a set of technical regulations for this subclass, copies of which are available from the Executive Officer – Off Road on (03) 9889 2327. In general terms the regulations closely follow the FIA T1 regulations, but do not have the same requirement for on-board fine extinguisher systems, bladder fuel tanks on FIA-

The intention behind this subclass is to encourage more participation in Class 7 which, at State and National championship levels, is suffering a significant shortage.

Initial enquiries have indicated that there is significant interest in the concept of a series production four-wheel drive subclass, and it will be recognised at National championship events. There will be no series awards – at least for 1997 – but trophies will be presented to subclass placegetters at AORC rounds. If sufficient interest is

displayed in this subclass over the next 12 months, it is intended to progress it to the next step.

Beckton's Scottish

AUSSIE COMES HOME IN 1997 SCOTTISH RALLY

Wodonga driver Martyn Beckton has significantly enhanced his international reputation with a Class N3 win in the 1997 Scottish Rally at Dumfries.

Driving a left-hand-drive Group N Vauxhall Astra, leased for him by CAMS Limited as a result of an Australian Relly Commission and Australian Sports Commission initiative, Beckton came from well down midway through the event to take the honours.

Beckton's effort was all the more commendable because he was unaccustomed to his vehicle. In Australia Beckton drives a right-hand-drive 4WD Lancer, and his reconnaissance for the event was done in a right-hand-drive front-wheel-drive Vauxhall. His first drive in the leased Vauxhall Astra was from his hotel to the start line!

Beckton began the three-day event from position 31, behind another Class N3 entrant, and his first day was one of mixed fortune.

At the end of Special Stage 5 he lay fourth in class and 30th outright, but a late afternoon disagreement with a stump bent a front strut and caused a major time loss on Special Stage 7.

The damage was repaired in the final service park for the day, and day two saw Beckton on a charge. He put in some extremely impressive times through the five stages, moving up 13 places outright to finish first in his Class N3 and finish 18th outright, with a class fastest time to his credit as well.

"Not being accustomed to the left-hand-drive Vauxhall, I was cutting right-hand corners at the start," Beckton said. "I wasn't thinking of the positions in the event — I just wanted to be competitive."

The final day was "a dream come true", with a combination of his dedicated service crew, a competitive car and his Silverstone tyres bringing him home in the competitive international event, "I couldn't be happier," he said.

Beckton, his Western Australian co-driver Claire Parker and managerimentor Greg Carr, topped an impressive list of Australians to win the Scottish trip. The "Driver to Scotland" program was designed to give local drivers some much-needed international experience with a view to having an Australian crew competitive in the World Raily Championship by the end of the decade.

Entrants for the sponsored trip had to compete in the first two rounds of the ARC Super Series and meet other criteria judged by a panel comprising Ron Cremen (international raily driver), Garry Connelly (Chairman, Australian Raily Commission), Peter Whitten (editor, Australian Railysport News) and Steve Frazer (Advantage International).

JOY RIDERS? WHERE DO YOU STAND?

From time to time we receive enquires from members of clubs on insurance cover in respect to rally practice and club promotional days.

The following advice has been received from Jen Grant, CAMS Manager - Office Services on this topic.

"As we are all aware motor sport of all kinds is dangerous and accidents causing death, bodily injury and disability can and do happen.

As the governing body of motor sport in Australia CAMS Limited has a responsibility to all its members and their families, to ensure safety measures and regulations are in place to offer responsible guidelines and protection to all.

When competing or undertaking private practice all participants must hold some form of CAMS licence, either competition or basic to be insured by CAMS Personal Accident Insurance coverage. You are also protected by CAMS Public Liability Insurance for bodily injury and/or property damage to third parties. Also, prior to participating in an event a Disclaimer Form must be signed, or in the case of an under aged participant this form must be signed by their legal guardian or parent.

CAMS Limited has, after several incidents in recent years, made a decision which they feel is in the best interests of all its members with regard to children riding in parents' competition vehicles, whilst these cars are participating in private practice/fun days and the like.

It has been found in several cases, that the children either because of their age, small body size, or in some cases due to the unavailability of suitable attire or, at the extreme, due to the less than diligent attitude of the driver, were being given 'joy rides' by their parents at practice days, fun days and the like, in an unsafe manner and without adequate protection, by way of helmels, shoes, clothing etc.

This causes not only CAMS Limited and their underwriters some serious concerns, and exposes the CAMS overall insurance programs to significant claims payouts, but places extreme pressure on family groups should an injury or death occur.

Most people are unaware that in the event of a child under the age of 18 years being injured, that child in his/her own right cannot take legal action, but can do so by way of their "next best friend". In most cases this would be their mother or father. Therefore, should a father have been driving a competition vehicle in which his son/daughter was a passenger and the father caused an accident which injured their offspring, you would then see a case of the child via their other parent suing their father. As you can envisage, this would be placing extreme stress upon the family group as a result of an avoidable injury.

Also, if Children are injured they have up to 3 years after their 18th birthday to take any legal action. If this legal action is covered by insurance then the court awards are based on the standards at the time of the settlement, not at the time of the accident occurring.

If a child is a CAMS member, participating in events in their own right, they are required, as are adult participants, to sign or have their parents or legal guardians sign a Disclaimer Form confirming that they are aware of the dangers of motor sport, but accept these risks and participate at their own free will.

However, usually at fun days and private practice days, quite often no Disclaimer Forms are signed particularly by passengers.

By maintaining high standards and self regulations within its sport, CAMS Limited, as the governing body, has avoided somewhat, government intervention in the running of our various sporting disciplines and therefore has retained a greater level of control when it comes to the setting of rules and regulations which can only be of a benefit to our membership. If however, we see an increase of incidents which could be perceived by the public in general as a result of frivolous activities or unsuitable rules and regulations then government intervention may occur".

It is recommended that the above explanation be included in your club magazine.


