Motorshow Monte Carlo Classic 1999 has been run and won

A healthy field of 54 starters were booked to face the various start points. A very wide range of car types were in there. A beautiful Mercedes 350SL (winkers did not work! Had to re-scrutineer), flash Mazda MX 5's, 1954 Morris Oxford, Jensen Interceptor, Healy sprites, MG's galore, Mini bricks and a sedate Wolsley with the Mackay's aboard.

Some of the younger vehicles included Erroll Rasmussens immaculate Falcon ute in BRG, Metro Fords XR 6 navigated by last years outright nav. Claire Swallow, Tony Kabel in a brand new MX5 and Subarus a-plenty.

There were four start points City,

Loganholme, Mt Ommaney and Strathpine. Each entrant had the opportunity to choose an all bitumen run or some gravel (approx 10 ~ 15%). All courses were different but did meet up with each other and run together for a while in true Monte Carlo Style. If you are guessing and saying, "hey that means eight courses in the event", you are right. It was a novel new approach to this classic and one which went down well with the competitors.

The city starters did a run through the City/Valley and out to Stafford Road, Brookside and Samford. Here they joined those which had started at Strathpine and gone North to Dakabin, Lakeside, Joyner and around to Samford. The gravel runners had a great drive along Clear Mountain Road. Only one car, a novice, got the question in the mid-

dle of the gravel bit, something must have caused the others to lapse in concentration (perhaps the view).

From Samford the Northern runners worked their way across to Brookfield-Pullenvale area. The gravel runners using Gap Creek Road the others out around Bardon and Chapel Hill. Before they ran west towards Ipswich and some great running around Kholo.

Meanwhile the Loganholme and the Mount Ommaney starters were heading west. Logan people headed quickly along Browns Plains Road to Ipswich Road at Gailes where they joined those that had started from Mount Ommaney. Out through

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When I woke up on the morning of the first of January in 1999, I made a conscious decision that between working, sleeping, eating and ablutions there were actually a couple of spare minutes I could find to throw something together for the BSCC club magazine. Hopefully this will also be a little more regular during the year in an effort to help our valiant (Chrysler??) editor-in-charge.

I recalled that the first magazine of the year traditionally comes out in February due to the absence of goings-on in the initial month of January. Henceforth I concluded that whatever I wrote about had to be interesting enough to keep the readers noses stuck in the pages of the magazine, and so a Christmassy anecdote about my new socks probably wouldn't do the job!

Then I thought, well, take a step back in time and have a peek at what was going on, say, ten years ago and let the words flow.

Picture this, Brisbane 1989......

In those heady days, the monthly issue of 'Brisport' was graced by photo images of the three major (only?) Club Champions - Rally, Off-Road and Motorkhana.

The Rally Champion for the previous year was Iain 'Garden Gnome' Stewart whose piccy was actually an action shot of he and Mr Coote competing in the 'Grand Prix Mazda' Mazda BFMR - back when those little things were still state-of-the-art.

The Off-Road Champ, I am embarrassed to say, I cannot recognise but for a hint, he is wearing a helmet and driving one of those buggy-things. There, that should narrow the field down a bit!!

The Motorkhana Champ was none other than Alan McConnell in his Mini Special, the same basic car in which Alan still competes on a state and national basis.

The Editor of the magazine at that time was none other than myself (Tom Smith) and I usually opened each issue with a commentary entitled 'Startline'. That year I'd been helping out Errol Bailey and Brian Swinton with the Cooloola Classic Rally, and the big news was the restriction of eligible classes to just PRC and the now-defunct CRC. As usual, the cry was there for "whingers who could see no further than the end of their Group G bonnets" to get out and volunteer for official tasks and road blocks - my, how times change (NOT!!!).

The pages contained an 'analysis' of CRC versus PRC with a run-down on the rules of CRC. In hindsight, CRC now looks just like present-day PRC with additional carburettor and exhaust freedoms!!

There was a one-page advertisement (I was always looking for 'fillers') on the forthcoming Motor Show Rally, which featured a wide-eyed Yahoo Serious (Yes, he was current at the time!).

This was also one of the first years I put together the 'Hugh Jarsoll Awards for efforts in Contemporary Motorsport' and the list featured such enamoured winners as - "Best Faux Pais of the Year by a Rally Director - Brian Crisp rolling his Escort while zero-ing the Sprint Rally at Esk"; "Longest Leap of 1988 - Dennis Brown's Subaru RX-Turbo at the bridge behind the Driver Training Centre at Gympie"; "Best Fall off a Hoist by a Rally Car - Any Class - Dennis's Subaru in a Redcliffe Workshop" and "The most Mispronounced Surname in Queensland - Johnny Goasdoue".

A six event Motorkhana Series was scheduled at a time when there was a nucleus of regular motorkhana-heads (myself included) and we all enjoyed this competition very much.

The mag also featured the final scores for the 1988 QRC, which saw Dennis Brown and John Hall take the top spot, from George Kahler/Tony Best (Mazda 323 4wd), Viv and Noel Gees (Yes, that Falcon) and John Goasdoue/Neal Wesche (Escort 2.0)

The leading driver on the seeding list was none other than Murray Coote. George Kahler was 4th, Peter Marcovich was 6th, Brucie Dummett 9th and Goasdoue was 10th!! Yours truly featured 25th in the navvies scores after some great runs with my old mate Peter Johnson.

The final scores for the GP CARS Cibie Novice Series were shown with Craig Lucey in his Laser S taking the trophies. John Goasdoue finished sixth but I think he was judged ineligible for the final rounds after some top finishes in earlier QRC events. Other names on that list included Shaun Gill (Datusn 1600), Peter Carruthers (Lancer), Barry Neuendorff (RX3 and Allen Jones (Datsun 1600).

That was pretty much that, as the magazine was fairly functional in those days and I can assure you we did not have the advantage of computer technology. I think the pages were all gestetner printed and we used to line up at the club around a table on the last Wednesday night of the month en masse to assemble and staple the magazine. Team-building, I like to call it!!

In ten years we've come a long way, and it's amazing to recall the names and faces that have come and gone. Some of us, for better or worse, are still around!!

Anyway, that's it from me for now - Have a happy 1999!!

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

Bad luck for Peter Whalley and his Datto 1600. Fuel pick up problems ruined his day. He eventually made it to Musgrave Park but out of time. It is heart breaking stuff.

Our thanks must go to the Brisbane International Motorshow Committee for sponsoring the event and the supply of infrastructure that will enable this Classic to grow in stature.

Also to the course checkers and setters, Jim Reddiex, Rod Sams and Stephen Christianson without whom the event would not have been ready on time. My wife for being patient as we found new roads etc and set the event and also spent hours with her friends putting the books together. Julie Christianson who collected all the door panels and put the numbers on them. On the weekend of 27/28 March, Brisbane Sporting Car Club is running a two day **Touring Road Rally**. This event consists of easy navigation and special tests over approximately 600 km of good roads in South East Queensland. The special tests are conducted on closed roads and are used to test the skill of the crew and the reliability of the vehicle.
