The event underwent a couple of changes this year following the lost of access to one of the major properties we used last


year. This required the establishment of a new pit /headquarters area and development of new sections of track.

This year we also included a Top Ten Shootout for the 10 fastest cars in Prologue. With \$1000 in prise money up for grabs the racing was enthusiastic.





Race Time Is Relative to ...?

Another KCF series has come and gone and much like the year, all to quickly. Again, hats off to all involved and keep it up – it's a great event. We had a hoot and I think I can say, I'm finally getting the hang of it (slow learner) and the last event would have to be one of the most relaxing and enjoyable events I've done yet. In fact I was so relaxed I had time to take in some of the forest scenery and some time pendering the theory's of the universe. Hamman... a nice way to run a race although I think Simon was carrying the whole relaxation thing a bit far when he neglected to turn the key and make that noisy thing at the front go broccom at the start of one of the competitive sections. I was wondering, for a moment, if he expected me to get out and push. Aubh! Drivers!

I have to say that the officials do a great job and when you look at the logistics of the whole thing from 'beginning to go,' it's incredible that it all comes together and usually without a hitch. We have some dedicated club members that have fantastic organisational skills. Yaaaay for them!

The day seemed to go so quickly and it got me thinking, what is race time relative to. Yeah, yeah... I know it's eastern standard time and all that stuff but why does it go so fast when your racing or panicking about something like a flat tyre or at what point in time the driver might actually be thinking about starting the car at the start line, but when your watching the clock with a minute to go it feels like an eternity. Well in between Simons regular ritual territorial race weekend tree marking sessions and my moments of forest gazing and high speed nature watching, I began to theorise the possible anomalies. I figured school kids have been pondering this for years during History and other mundante classes so that got me thinking about Einstein's theories of time and relativity. Einstein believed that if you could travel away from an object at the speed of light then time would stand still. I do in fact question this theory based on the principle that this would actually half the time in relation to what you are travelling toward. Being that every action has an equal and opposite reaction if you were travelling away from something you would have to also be travelling toward something but never the less it seemed a good basis to ground my theorising on and hey, what else is there to do in the middle of a race.

I figured that if we were to compete on a section that was perfectly straight with a length of 288 000 Km (with a couple of jumps thrown in just so we could prove the 'what goes up must come down' theory) we could in fact complete a section with a time of 0.00 (I think). I explored this further, as you do! We would have to be travelling at a leisurely speed of around 288 000 Km per second. Not a big ask although this might be a problem for its as the Dato's speedo is in miles per hour. Of course we would need to take into account the Barths rotational speed of around 1000 miles per hour and the latitudinal and curvature issues associated with a sphere, and not to forget the resistive properties of wind and surface area, but this is all too hard for my pea brain so I'll round up or down to the nearest, most convenient figure or convincing argument. Now if we travelled East we would have to decrease our speed to account for the Earth's rotation. And naturally if we travelled West, the speed would have to increase proportionally to account for the same. If we were travelling away from the time control, the time on the clock would effectively stand still. Here is the problem. If we were also looking at the finish control through special super dooper binoculars, the light reflecting off the clock would not have reached us yet so we would in fact be seeing a previous time that no longer exists. So if our competitive stages are mainly running in an Easterly direction, which they must all be according to my theory, it would make sense that time would speed up. And that would explain why it takes so long to watch a clock, because they must all be facing the west which places the reflective light in a parallax with the rotational direction of the Earth which in turn causes the reflected image to take longer to reach you.
