PRESIDENTS REPORT MAY 2016

It is with a sense of humility and excitement that I sit down to write my first report as President of BSCC. For those who may not know me or not know me well, I became involved again in the sport in 1994 after a gap in my involvement of about a decade while things like establishing a career, starting a family and putting down roots took up most of my time. Since 1994 I have worked at various levels as an official in club, QRC, ARC and eventually WRC levels of Rallying. Highlights being the last two years as Deputy Clerk of Course of IROQ and being Chief Marshall at the challenging 2009 WRC event when world rallying came back to Australia. So I have seen a lot of what makes an event tick. But I soon realised that whether it is a Come 'n Try or a WRC, the essential ingredients are the people, the cars and the camaraderie.

Like many, deep down inside I was a frustrated rally driver and so after perhaps one of the more protracted builds in history I finally got my Alfa Romeo GTV6 onto a rally stage and while it hasn't done as many events as I had hoped, this year we are having a crack, so I am learning fast of the whole other dimension of being a competitor and a customer of the event. I still enjoy the 'what you still going' comments, they never get old.

Away from BSCC I have a background in engineering and business development. I am currently Export Manager for a long established Australian based company and am indeed fortunate to have spent much time working and travelling in overseas markets. That has certainly expanded my horizons, and I decided to join the Board of BSCC three years ago to lend whatever knowledge and experience I could. As a side benefit of my work I have managed to attend several rallies in the UK and NZ recently. So I have seen how they face the restrictions and challenges they face and yet still put on innovative types of events which are well regarded.

As incoming President I must extend a huge thanks to Barry Neuendorff who saw the club through four tumultuous years to emerge stronger and ready to face the future. It is hard to appreciate the debt the club owes to him, and he has shouldered huge burdens to keep it alive. I am always aware of the history of BSCC and the contribution of those who have gone before to keep Rallying and Off-Road happening in South East Queensland. So on the shoulders of giants I look to how to continue to make the sport vibrant and exciting. I am also especially pleased that we have had a number of members willing to step up and assist by becoming part of the board to contribute

this knowledge and experience. We have a good cross-section of the club membership.

Paul Woodward comes in as Vice-President in combination with his role as QRAP Chairman and brings many years of senior officiating including regular stints in WRC and APRC rallies. I look to him to keep us abreast of what is happening with the wider motorsport community and CAMS. We have Tony Kabel and John Coleman, both respected senior officials to bring a perspective on our trusted volunteers. To bring a competitor's perspective we have Margot Knowles, Russell Hewitt, John Black and David Bannister. Between them they cover the experience range from long term ARC and international competition to getting started in motorsport. Look them up with suggestions and constructive feedback. To assist the Board we also have Adrian Clark, himself a respected senior official to advise on social media and Ryan Preston as Club Captain, who many will know as an extremely dedicated co-driver and soon to be on the other side of the car. Plus to round things out there are three Past-Presidents in Barry Neuendorff, Craig Porter and Rod Sams to provide guidance and experience. I am also very thankful that Margaret MacKay will continue to open the office and keep our accounts in order plus the myriad other things she does.

With such a team in place I am asking their help to ensure events are financially viable. Then once that is dealt with get onto the fun part of delivering enjoyable, safe, good quality events. We also need to look after our officials with training, mentoring and recognition wherever we can to keep people coming through and keep them coming back. Our competitors are what makes events tick, so we have been doing our best to put on good events with something for most. It is a two way street, we need the support of competitors to make events successful and provide constructive feedback.

So I hope everyone appreciates we have a great team in place, now to continue the good work. Do your bit and seek out your board members and share constructive thoughts. I also hope everyone has noticed what a good start to the year BSCC has enjoyed. We had the hugely successful Future Auto Rally Experience Day where a good field faced the challenges and we had some new blood hungry for more. A successful Off-Road event that exceeded expectations, and the first round of the QRC, the SR Automotive Manumbar Rally. That was the best field to start a QRC in Queensland in some many years, and they were treated to a fantastic event. As Margot said, she never saw me without a smile all day, and I was not the only one. Barry and his ever enthusiastic crews have also been feverishly sizzling sausages. This has been the difference between surviving or not in the last year. Of course all along we have been supported by our world class volunteer officials.

Things go a little quiet for BSCC in the next few months as many members will be involved supporting or entering the Wowan QRC and then IROQ in June. I wish both events well as a strong sport is a good sport. But the time will be put to good use. Craig Porter is working on a short course rally to be run in some stages around the Cooloola area on July 16. Somewhere we have not been for years. It will also be part of the Novice series so please turn out to help and encourage those making their way into the sport. We are also investigating a new style of event for late in July leading into Ian Gorski's QRC round at Benarkin on September. The event last year was off to a good start when the weather cruelly intervened. Along with some further new roads we also have a new date earlier in the year so the signs are good. There are also some smaller events being planned so keep an eye on the calendar and watch Facebook or the website for updates.

Have fun, get involved, share your thoughts, let's build it back up.

Life Membership 2016

Barry Neuendorff

Barry Neuendorff has become quite the fixture and one of the most recognised faces around Rallying in Queensland since he burst onto the scene in the early 1980's. Barry's interest in the sport grew as a mechanic then owner of the Total Garage at Brookside and then to the purchase in 1977 of the Ampol Albany Creek service station.

It was here in 1982 that he was approached by a couple of well-known rally enthusiasts namely Keith Tapsall and Rod Browning to sponsor a rally starting from the Servo. With Barry's typical penchant to get things underway he and Keith soon had the cream of the crop of drivers from South of the border in local cars competing. Such names as Colin Bond, Bruce Garland, Ed Mulligan and George Fury a champion in the ACT who in fact stayed at Barry's home for the weekend event entered with a cut-off of 92 competitors. The event was a huge success with prize money for all stages from first to third. He was hooked.

Jim Reddix another perennial rally director convinced Barry to help with Jim's event run out of Gallangowan, Barry said yes and then began a long and endearing friendship. Barry was deputy in 1985 then took over the reins in 1987 as Clerk of Course through to 1992 when he handed the job to Craig Porter. The Gallangowan event was the last event of the year and was a time for some wonderful parties at Gallangowan going in to the wee hours of the next day. For reasons known only to Barry it became a three event weekend with a Rallysprint at Darlington Park Raceway at Eight Mile Plains then with a QRC event starting at Keema Mt Gravatt owned by another Life Member Henk Kabel and wending its way through stages at the back of Woodford Bellthorpe then Jimna and finally to Gallangowan - all that with twelve club radios. Then he would have us all out of bed early for a 60km Club Rally on Sunday morning. Thank God we were young and silly. These events took an enormous amount of organising but were fun.

Not only hooked as an organiser the garage was doing rather well so in 1987 along came a Mazda RX3 Coupe rally car mostly built at the garage. Now it gets a bit fuzzy here because sources want to protect the innocent, but it seems that Barry wanted the best of co drivers for his first event and so appointed Rod Browning to the role. The event was at Jimna and somewhat hazy history tells us that Barry suffered a "soft roll" going uphill on one of the stages.

He went on to win a number of rallies in this car including Bailey Powerlines in 1988 and many class wins. He was still running events and assisting at the Club with his usual enthusiasm and attention to detail. Boy oh boy that could drive a sane man to drink sometimes!!!!

In 1990 he bought the nicely appointed Peugeot 205 from Ian Reddiex - Ross Perry, Ian's co driver went with the car and then began a friendship that not only crossed rallying but into a business partnership called SaabCare based out of Stones Corner.

Another old mate of Barry's jumped into the silly seat - Alan Staib who guided him to a third in class in the 1992 BP Rally a round of the ARC. I might just add here that Staiby fell down on the job here a little, running late to get to the start of the event Barry was booked for speeding around Everton Park way. Probably enough to get the juices really working and as mentioned a third in class - not too shabby. He sold the car in 1992.

Away from the Clubs activities Barry joined Queensland Rally Panel in 1994 taking the chair in 1998 through to 2003, then stepped down to a Panel Member through to 2014. It was during the early 90's he gained a penchant for course checking a role he holds dear to his heart ever mindful of the tulip in the roadbook being an exact replication of the what is seen by the driver. This role has taken him to many car club events.

In 2009 he took on the role of Clerk of Course for the WRC Test Event run at Urbenville followed by organising the Shakedown and Media Day at Kingscliffe. To top off the weekend he was the Information Car for the event as well. He was involved in the Queensland round of the ARC as a Competitor Relations Officer and then followed this role into IROQ. It was here as President he hosted the FIA Observer among a number of tasks he fulfilled for that event.

He turned his hand to Off Road events in 2012 deputising to Rod Sams which was the final round of the Australian Off Road Championship then in future years as Clerk of Course for other Off Road events at Mulgowie.

Stewarding has also played a part in his motorsport activities spending time at most of the events throughout South East Queensland highlighting a steward's role with the V8's Support Category at Queensland Raceway.

His success has been recognised with the following Awards.

The Official of the Year Award for 2010

An Australia Day award for the TJM Lockyer 300 Off Road Event from the Lockyer Valley Regional Council Australia Day Awards for 2013

But most importantly of all is the dedication Barry has shown over the last four years as President of our Club. The Club has suffered difficulties during his tenure as President and it is his sheer persistence that has seen the Club return to its former self.

His involvement in raising funds to support the Club including his work with Bunnings sausage sizzles has seen financial strength return.

This has also brought Club members together along with other social activities instigated by him as President.

With Barry's many years of support, his dedication - he is a perfect example of the Club's desire to award exemplary members with our highest award - that of Life Member.

Barry please wear this Life Member Badge with honour as a memento of your considerable support to the Brisbane Sporting Car Club.

Presidents Report from AGM

Evening All,

2015 has been a year of decisions, which actually started in 2014, that will make it in the years to come, notable for the club's turnaround and guidance on another course. These decisions were not easy to make, but nevertheless were made to improve the clubs direction.

The major decision was:

Due to the APRC and the ARC Championships falling out of favour with competitors in 2015, the decision was made not to promote the International Rally of Queensland for 2016 which would have put the club's financial position again at risk, a move which the Board was comfortable in making. The 2016 event, if held was facing a substantial reduction in the monetary grant from Tourism and Events Queensland. By the close of the 2015 year there were signs we had started to reverse the direction of the club's financial position and certainly in no way wanted to re-visit many of the previous financial positions. Removing the risk had given the Board a much more positive atmosphere to work under, knowing there would not be a huge drain on clubs finances and an increase of attention paid to the club by key officials.

The 2015 year itself, started well with David Nash and John Keen's Come and Try Event in Jimna, being well attended which set the precedence for the year. To add to that, the Bunnings BBQ's have been a blessing in disguise in providing funds, not only helping pay the club's overheads but to reduce Henk's loan. The BBQ's in the 2015 year produced a net income to the club of \$10,276.32

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


- The scope of the questions will very wide; ranging from quite easy to well nigh impossible!



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
