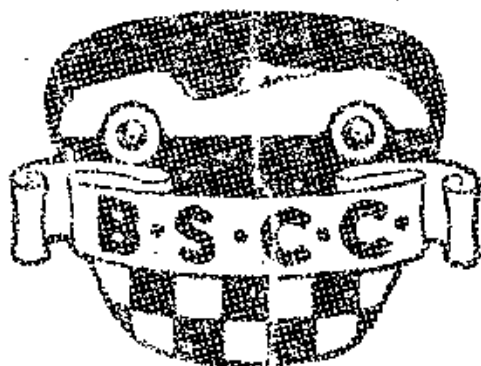

QUEENSLAND first INTERNATIONAL MOTOR RACE MEETING at
LAKESIDE.....9th, 10th & 11th FEB.

Some of the World's most outstanding Drivers will compete at the International Motor Racing Carnival at Lakeside on the 9th, 10th & 11th Feb. The Timetable for the Meeting is Scrutineering Thursday 8th Feb. 7pm to 9pm at the Chermiside Drive In Centre as well as at the Circuit on Friday & Saturday. Practice at Lakeside on Friday 1 to 4pm Saturday 12 to 3pm. Racing Saturday 3 to 4-30pm and Sunday 12 to 4-30pm. In the 45 miles (30 laps) final event to start at 3-30pm on Sunday, 11th Feb. there will be a line-up of the best Australian Drivers opposing the best Overseas Drivers.

Some of the Entrants competing at Lakeside will include, JACK BRABHAM - COOPER CLIMAX One of the greatest Drivers the World has ever known being champion of the World in 1959 & 1960 and the only Driver ever to win 5 World Championship Events in a row. Jack will be Driving a 2.7 Litre Cooper Climax.

LORENZO BANDINI - COOPER MASERATI Bandini, dark, good looking and 24, is the quite tip in Europe as a driver to be watched in the coming few seasons, for in an unspectacular way he has been cautiously climbing the ladder and is currently rated as the best Italian driver of single seaters.

RON FLOCKHART - LOTUS Scotsman, Ron has reached the peak in sports car racing by winning twice at Le Mans for Jaguar. Long chief tester for the B.R.M. venture. Quite, but blunt Scottish approach and a sardonic sense of humour, Ron is one of the most popular of the overseas drivers.

JOHN SURTEES - COOPER Five times world motor cycle champion. Still, only 27 Surtees was given a place with team Lotus for occasional drives in 1960. He startles hardened observers with his ability to turn in tremendously quick laps.

BRUCE McLAREN - COOPER A year ago was runner up in the world championship to team mate Jack Brabham, and the youngest driver to have won a grand epreuve. Bruce is now No 1 driver for the Famous Cooper Works.
