The month of October is now behind us we seem to be gathering momentum towards the end of the year. Despite October flying by we hadn't any events. It's not to say nothing is happening behind the scenes in our countdown to Christmas and our long-awaited party on the 11th of December.

During this time, the board has been considering new technology which should take our communications well into the future. Our current radio system has provided more than solid service. In fact, the radios and the supporting infrastructure have been part of the mainstay behind our most iconic events for the past 20+ years. Many may not know but our radio network comprises a lot more than radios but repeaters and permanent and non-permanent aerials so our network footprint can cover vast areas while at the same time cutting through heavily forested hills and valleys. Anyone who has sat on a road block or operated as an SOS would have experienced the highs and lows of our radios but looking back, it has been a valuable resource.

The club has been the very lucky recipient of the tireless work and expertise of many people over the years and if I started naming them I am sure I would leave some out so I can't. Suffice to say there has been 10's of 1,000's of hours of work plus equipment donated over the years by these club members and supporters whose help has meant we have been able to run events.

However, with the passage of time has come the progress of technology. The types of radios we use are gradually being phased out by manufacturers. Part of the downside of that is growing difficulty sourcing replacement parts and the ever-increasing costs of repairs and servicing. The club has a good store of radios, repeaters, antennas and power options which we will continue to use. The time has now come to look to the future so in parallel to our current equipment, the club is planning a transition to state-of-the-art communications equipment which will first be tested though out all of 2022 with a view to full rollout thereafter.

Speaking of 2022, the BSCC is planning a bumper year of events. On the drawing board so far are six rally events, a Test and Tune, at least one off road racing event and some fun runs. It is more than we have been able to plan in the last two years mainly due to COVID but we are confident 2022 will mark the beginning of a new PC Era – Post COVID (restrictions) that is.

The six rallies we are planning include a new QRC event based in Nanango to be followed by a three event Short Course Pace Noted series leading into Accent Benchtops Rally Queensland and then the ever popular Imbil based QRC event. This means four of our six events will be pace noted. Just before all the excitement of competition starts, we are planning a Test and Tune and to finish the year, an off road event. Interspersed in these we will be trying to conduct some fun runs. Our spies tell us the dates are soon to be confirmed by Queensland State Council so when that happens, we can announce the calendar in full so everyone can prepare for the year ahead.

Speaking about Fun Runs, we're doing one. By now you may have seen on our BSCC Facebook Page a flier for a Fun Run being conducted by the club and planned by Laurie Garth and Judy Foster. The run will kick off from The Hub Shopping Centre at Burpengary at 9:00am on Sunday 28th of November. Please keep an eye out on Facebook and your inbox for further details about registration and when to arrive for your start.

One week prior to our Fun Run, the Gold Coast Tweed Motorsports Club is conducting the long anticipated QRC event at Mundubbera. A little bird whispered in my ear the event is bursting at the seams for entries. The event has great support from Accent Benchtops and from what I can see it looks to be a great final event for 2021. I would like to, on behalf of the BSCC, express our best wishes to the GCTMC for a successful event. I am of the view that a rising tide lifts all boats so a great rally in November will be a great lead in to what we plan to be a BIG next year.





Vale Bruce Hodgson

For those that are not aware a Rally great Bruce Hodgson passed away on the 30/9/2021 at the age of 89.

The first time I met Bruce was when he competed in the 1992 Gallangowan round of the QRC as a test of the car, a XT Falcon GT that he was going to run in the 1993 London-Sydney Marathon. This event took place 25 years after the first London-Sydney Marathon.

CAMS allowed Marathon Specification cars to run in State Championship events as a test for the upcoming Marathon, however they were not allowed to score points or win awards. Bruce was also running in the event to check that he was still capable as it had been a few years since he last competed. He was also purchasing fuel off other competitors because in the time Bruce had "retired" form the sport events were no longer arranged that you travelled through towns between competitive stages and could buy fuel at Service Stations. No need for a Service Crew to carry fuel.

Bruce ran as zero car testing and sorting another competitors car in the Gold Coast Tweed Motorsport Club's round of the QRC about twelve years ago.

Bruce was a CAMS delegate for the GCTMC for many years and was awarded Life Membership of that club. He was also a regular attendee at State Rally Panel when he lived at the Gold Coast.



Bruce was an excellent public speaker as he demonstrated at the 2001 Awards Dinner where he was the guest speaker and kept the audience amused with his stories and wit.

He also had a serious side and at that dinner also mentioned that if Competitors wanted to further their careers they needed to learn to public speak and quoted the TAFE Public Speaking course to attend.

Bruce was also in attendance at the 2019 SR Automotive Manumbar Rally. Many who were there spoke to Bruce and listened to his wisdom and wit. Bruce was living at Warwick at the time and this was possibly the last time due to his deteriorating health that Bruce was able to drive a long distance to attend a Rally.
