All intending competitors for this Trial are advised to attend. The briefing will start at the Clubrooms at approx 8.30 P.M.




Jack and Mavis Barrow and co organiser Keith Britton have just about finished the Organisation of this Trial. They have told us that it will be a beauty. We abve printed in full below the Supplementary Regulations for this event.

GENERAL SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS.

- I. The event shall be known as the "Ross' Auto Accessories 65 Trial", hereinafter called the "Event" and shall be conducted by the Brisbane Sporting Car Club under the International Sporting Code and the National Competition Rules of C.A.M.S. and these Regulations. C.A.M.S. ruling for the event will be Junior and Senior B. The Senior section only counting towards the Trials Championship Award 1965.
- 2. The event shall be promoted by Ross' Auto Accessories, Lutwyche Rd, Windsor, and conducted by the B.S.C.C. The Organisers shall be: J.Barrow and K.Britton.
- 3. The event shall be held on Sunday, 4th July, 1965, over a course of approx. ISC Miles for seniors and IGC Miles for juniors with a duration of approx. 8 hours. There will be a lunch stop at Beaudesert, where Fuel and Refreshments will be available. The first car will leave Ross' Auto Accessories, Lutwyche Road, Windsor at 7.30 AM and the remainder will follow at 2 minute intervals.

Competitors must report to the start control at least 30 minutes prior to their due starting time. Starting times will be decided by ballot and competitors will be notified of their starting times by mail. Senior entrants will leave the start control first. A briefing for the event will be conducted at the B.S.C.C. Club rooms on Wednesday the 30th June, starting at 3 P.M.

 - 3A. Senior Section: Competitors in the senior section will require a twelve inch ruler marked in tenths; a speedo marked in tenths will be necessary. This section will be conducted on speedo readings with elapsed times and average speed sections. Map sections will be included and official maps will be supplied by the organisers but competitors are permitted to carry any maps they so desire.
 - 3B. Junior Section: Competitors in the junior section will require a twelve inch school ruler. This section will not require a speedo reading in tenths and will be conducted on observation points and map sections with clapsed times and a verage speed. A Junior competitor is one who has not been :-
 - I. placed Ist, 2nd, or 3rd., in any open Trial in Australia.
 - 2. competed in more than 6 open Trials in Australia.
 - 3. competed in any trial over 500 miles in length in Australia. Provision is made on a seperate form for competitors to nominate the section they intend entering. Juniors will, if they so desire, be permitted to enter the senior section of the trial without infringement of their junior status.
 - 4. The event shall be open to all members of the public and to all types of motor vehicles (except four wheel drive) with a load capacity not exceeding I2 cwt. A change of driver is not permitted.
 - 5. The Stewards of the meeting shall be Messrs.G.Bernhagen, H.Kehl and R.Knowles.
 - 6. The Trial Director shall be Mr.J.Barrow and the Clerk of Course shall be Mr.K.Britton. The Secretary of the meeting shall be Mrs J.Barrow. Phone 49 3359.
 - 7. Entries shall be open from the issue of these Supplementary Regulations and shall close, for an entry fee of £1/5/C for Members of the Brisbane Sporting Car Club and £1/10/O for non members, on Wednesday the 30th June, 1965, at 8 P.M. The entry forms may be sent to Ross' Auto Accessories at Windsor or Coorparoo, the Organisers of the event or the Secretary of the Club, R.Gillespie, 9 Narthanya Street, West Chermside, Phone 59 6070. The entry form must be correctly completed and must be accompanied by the correct entry fee by 8 P.M. on the 30th June otherwise they will not be accepted.




