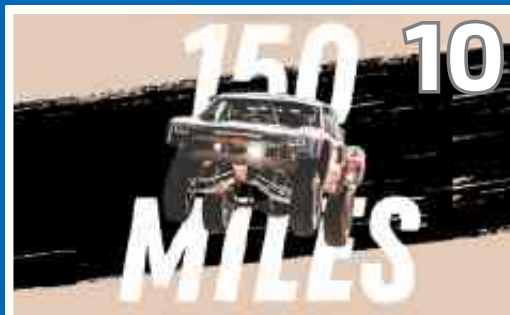

Director since April 2023.

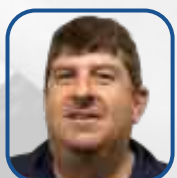

THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WITH TONY KABEL

Hello again and welcome to the second edition of BRISPORT for 2026.

As I mentioned in the last edition, it was shaping up to be a busy year for our club, and it certainly has been for many of our event organisers and volunteer officials.

Since the last edition, three events have been completed. First and foremost was the Accent Benchtops Rally Queensland, and what an event it was. This year saw a number of significant changes to the rally. The relocation of the service park into the centre of town proved to be a hit with both competitors and spectators alike. The introduction of the Super Special Street Stage, also located in the heart of town, created a fantastic atmosphere throughout the entire weekend.

One thing that was somewhat unexpected was the level of spectator attendance and social media engagement the event attracted. Between Wheels on Mary, the street stage and the forest stages, more than 45,000 people attended the event. Social media activity during and after the rally generated over 2.8 million views, with posts still appearing more than two months later.

The success of this event was the result of the hard work and dedication of many people. If I attempted to name everyone involved, I would undoubtedly miss someone, but there are a few individuals whose contributions deserve special recognition.

To Brian and Lyn Everitt, Malcolm and Gwen Bartolo, and Craig Porter – without your commitment, support and willingness to step up at short notice, this event would not have been possible. A special thank you also goes to Matt Allard for his tireless work with sponsors and stakeholders before, during and after the rally.

I would also like to acknowledge Mayor Glen Hartwig and his team at Gympie Regional Council for their support and confidence in the Brisbane Sporting Car Club. Their partnership helped make the rally one of the largest events ever held in the Gympie region and has established a strong foundation for the future of Rally Queensland.

Less than a month after the Accent Benchtops Rally Queensland, we were in Miles for the running of the Miles Tyre & Battery 150 Long Course Off-Road Race. This was the club's first off-road event for several years and our first event conducted under AASA sanctioning.

A quality field of 38 crews lined up to tackle the challenging 28-kilometre circuit, completing eight laps over two days of competition. The event provided excellent racing and was thoroughly enjoyed by both competitors and spectators.

A special thank you goes to Iain Robertson and, once again, Craig Porter for their hard work and dedication in delivering what was a fantastic and successful event.

Earlier this month saw the running of the Bear Electrical Jimna Rally sprint (QRC Round 3), held in the forests around Jimna. While the event attracted a smaller field, the quality of competition was outstanding as crews tackled eight stages on roads that were new to many competitors. The challenging route tested both drivers and co-drivers, with even some of the more experienced navigators finding the stages demanding.

A special thank you to Matt Sosimenko for stepping up as Clerk of Course for the event. With the support of several experienced club members, Matt delivered a well-organised and enjoyable rally that was well received by competitors and officials alike.

We would also like to thank Peter and the team at Jimna Base Camp for their ongoing support of both the event and our club. Their hospitality and assistance continue to play an important role in the success of motorsport activities in the Jimna region.



To round out the year, we still have two rounds of the Queensland Rally Championship remaining. Both events have undergone date changes to allow the club, volunteer officials and competitors time to regroup following a very busy first half of the season.

Round 4, The Classic Queensland, will now be held on 15 August and will again be based out of the Manumbar Campdraft Grounds. With more than 130 kilometres of competitive stages, including three night stages, it promises to provide a challenging event for crews and a spectacular experience for spectators and officials alike.

Preparations are already well underway, and we look forward to welcoming competitors back to the forests around Manumbar. The final round of the championship will now be held on the long weekend of the 3rd and 4th of October and will see the service park and rally HQ base at the Imbil Showgrounds. Similar to last year we will run two events one S2 Rally Sprint on Saturday and one on Sunday.

As always, these events would not be possible without the dedication of our volunteer officials, event organisers, sponsors. Their continued support ensures we can deliver safe, enjoyable and competitive events.

I encourage all members to get involved where possible, whether as a competitor, official or volunteer. The success of our events depends on the efforts of many people behind the scenes, and every contribution is valued.

I hope to see you all in the forest very soon.

The inaugural Miles Tyre and Battery 150 Miles has been run and won, with competitors, volunteers, sponsors and spectators alike deeming the event an overwhelming success.

While conditions were very dusty, necessitating some adjustments to scheduling throughout the weekend, competitors in the ARB Mickey Thompson Queensland Off Road championship enjoyed both the format and the course.



And what dust! Early in the week prior to the event, the deputy clerk of the course, Craig Porter, and myself spent a very wet couple of days in track marking, wondering how much taller the mud would make the both of us as it stuck to the bottom of our shoes. By Friday, however, that rain was the most distant of memories, with fine powdery bulldust instead making its appearance in many sections of the track – something which would cause more than a few competitors a bit more of a surprise than perhaps they might have liked.

A field of 36 starters took to the track at Rakaia on Saturday morning, with less than one minute separating the top 10 competitors at the end of Section 1. This carried through to the end of Sunday, with the top three cars separated by less than two minutes after 240 kilometres of some of the toughest surfaces the Western Downs had to offer!

Ultimately, consistency paid off for Tony Fehlhaber (138), who consistently featured in the top three all weekend, and walked away with outright first place. Demonstrating the nature of the course and terrain, second and third place went to Craig Krog (23) and Conroy Devine (608) respectively – representing three very different classes of vehicle, all of which were in contention throughout the weekend.

The event started on Friday evening with scrutineering and a formal welcome to the event courtesy of the Western Downs Regional Council deputy mayor, Councillor Kylie Bourne, at the Miles Historical Village Museum. This was an uncommon choice for a scrutineering venue, and one which paid off with hundreds of spectators paying a visit to see the cars before Saturday's action kicked off out at the property north of Miles.

Spectators who made the time to come to the property were rewarded with plenty of dust and action, as well as excellent catering courtesy of the Miles State High School's senior students.

It would be remiss of me not to thank our various sponsors and supporters in the lead up to this event. First, thanks must go to our naming rights sponsor, Miles Tyre and Battery, and proprietor Blake Althaus for his support from the very first for this event. Closely behind him were the Western Downs Regional Council, who could not have been more helpful with both financial and logistical support in the lead up and during this event; IGA Miles for support particularly in feeding our volunteers all weekend; NEBGAR Engineering, Neilsen Transport, ARRG Chinchilla, and Coates Hire Chinchilla for their considerable contributions towards event logistics; the Gympie Auto Sports Club and its members for their assistance and counsel all weekend. And of course our 40-plus volunteer officials, who spent the weekend in a range of roles from checkpoints to recoveries and on to spectator and pit control, without whom events like this simply cannot run, let alone succeed.

The final thanks must of course go to Robert Parkinson, for the very generous support he showed in getting this event off the ground – both in terms of providing the property itself, and in the form of significant road and track preparation before and after the event. We look forward to planning for the 2027 running: watch this space!









WINNING WEIDMAN



JOSH JUMPS TO THE TOP OF THE PODIUM IN JIMNA

The Bear Electrical Jimna Rallysprint produced one of the closest contests of the 2026 Queensland Rally Championship so far, with perfect winter conditions setting the scene for an exciting second round of the series.

The fight for outright honours ebbed and flowed throughout the eight stages. Josh Weidman and Ryan Preston, Ian Menzies and Bob McGowan, and Brad Hardaker and Brad Jones all spent time in contention, with only seconds separating the leading crews for most of the day. A strong run home saw Weidman and Preston secure victory by 19 seconds, while Menzies and McGowan edged Hardaker and Jones for second on countback after the two crews finished tied on time. Andrew Carrigan and Liam Hinschen capped off an outstanding drive by bringing their two-wheel-drive Mitsubishi Magna home fourth outright.

Carrigan and Hinschen were untouchable in the 2WD category, claiming every stage win to take a commanding class victory. Cameron and Melody Taylor finished second, with Mitchell and Brent Plant rounding out the podium after a competitive battle throughout the rally.

The Plant brothers also turned the tables in the Junior Championship. After trailing early, they steadily built momentum to take control of the event and eventually claim victory by almost three minutes over Ella Pyyvaara, while Ari Wedlock secured third after a determined performance.



Acworth Recruitment Clubman delivered plenty of drama, with the lead changing hands several times before Ian Griffin and Emmett McNulty dominated the afternoon to take a convincing victory. Michael Tuppin and Russell Hewitt finished second, while Michelle Van Der Wilk and Cassandra Brumly completed the podium.

Elsewhere, Miika Baksa and Ian Swinbourne enjoyed a reliable run to take honours in the Woolgoolga Service Centre Novice category, while Graeme and Callum Page claimed Rally Regularity victory ahead of Vaughn Strydom and Sean Wild.

With another thrilling round in the books, the Queensland Rally Championship now heads to the Classic Queensland Rally in August, where the championship battle is set to continue.

SOCIAL NAVIGATION RUN

The Brisbane Sporting Car Club's Somerset Saunter once again proved that an enjoyable day behind the wheel doesn't require a stopwatch. CLASSIC RALLYING RETURNS TO GALLANGOWAN THIS AUGUST



The countdown is on for one of the highlights of the Queensland rally calendar, with Classic Queensland returning to the iconic Gallangowan forests on 15 August 2026.

Renowned for its fast, flowing roads and rich rallying history, Gallangowan has long been regarded as one of Queensland's premier rally venues. This year's event will once again showcase the famous forest roads that helped establish the area's reputation, with competitors tackling approximately 130 competitive kilometres, including the added challenge of three spectacular night stages.

Classic Queensland will feature as a round of both the Queensland Rally Championship, with competitors contesting three championship heats, and the East Coast Classic Rally Series for both two-wheel-drive and four-wheel-drive classic cars. The event promises an exciting mix of modern and historic machinery, with an Otago-style running order allowing spectators to enjoy classic rally cars and the latest generation of rally machinery together throughout the day. Spectators will be well catered for, with two dedicated viewing locations, including the ever-popular Gallangowan Forestry Camp. With multiple passes through each spectator point, fans will have six opportunities to experience the sights and sounds of the field as it charges through the forest.





Adding another element to the event will be the MCL M-Sport Escort Challenge, run by Oisin McLoughlin from MCL M-Sport, which will award a prize to the highest placed Ford Escort home.



Whether you're competing, servicing or spectating, Classic Queensland is shaping up to be another unforgettable weekend of rallying in one of Queensland's most iconic forests.

BSCC Returns to the Gympie Music Muster
With a welcome break between rally events on the calendar, Brisbane Sporting Car Club will once again be lending a hand at one of Queensland's biggest and best-loved festivals—the Gympie Music Muster, to be held from 27–30 August 2026 at the Amamoor Creek State Forest.

While it might be a long way from flying through forest stages, the Muster has become a favourite volunteer opportunity for many BSCC members. Not only does it provide valuable fundraising support for the Club, it's also a fantastic chance to spend a few days enjoying a unique atmosphere, meeting new people and experiencing one of Australia's premier country music festivals from the inside.

BSCC volunteers assist by operating the Banjo patrons' shuttle bus, transporting festival-goers the short 800 metres between their campground and the festival gates. Volunteers work in pairs to ensure safety while helping passengers of all ages board and disembark the bus. Every trip brings plenty of laughs, interesting conversations and the opportunity to meet people from all walks of life.

One of the biggest attractions is the flexibility. Rosters are designed around each volunteer's availability, with most shifts lasting around four to five hours, and longer shifts generally no more than six to seven hours. This leaves plenty of free time to relax, catch up with fellow club members or enjoy everything the Muster has to offer. Volunteers also receive a great range of benefits, including free camping with excellent shower and toilet facilities (and hopefully electricity once again!), complimentary tea and coffee throughout the day, breakfast at Banjo's Camp Kitchen for those on early shifts, and free entry to the festival while volunteering.



If you've never experienced the Gympie Music Muster before, this is a fantastic opportunity to enjoy a very different kind of event while supporting the Club. Whether you're a regular volunteer or considering helping out for the first time, we'd love to see plenty of BSCC members getting involved once again.
